It is our responsibility to create an environment in which skills such as public speaking, critical thinking, and teamwork can be practiced in a safe and respectful place.

The National Math Club Teacher: Mr. Thomas Weekday: Fridays

National Math Club members meet weekly to participate in fun math activities and games. In addition, members collaborate to complete a year-long project which earns our school gold-level recognition and awards. Enrollment in this club is not dependent on your math skill level, all skill levels are welcome!

Competition Math Algebra-I Club (Invitation Based) Teacher: Ms. Koc Weekday: Mondays and Tuesdays

Algebra-I students will be assessed and evaluated after taking a diagnostic test that determines a top group of mathletes who will compete in several math competitions throughout the year. These competitive events may include Mathcounts, Mu-Alpha-Theta, AMC 8, etc. as both teams and individuals.

Competition Math Pre-Algebra Club (Invitation Based) Teacher: Mr. Yakishma Weekday: Mondays and Wednesdays

Competition Math Pre-Algebra is an invitation based club for students who are taking Pre-Algebra. Pre-algebra students will be assessed and evaluated after taking a diagnostic test that determines a top group of mathletes who will compete in several math competitions throughout the year such as Mathcounts, AMC 8, etc. as teams and individuals.

Mathcounts Advanced Club (Invitation Based) Teacher: Mr. Akyalcin Weekday: Fridays

This club is for both Pre-Algebra, and Algebra I Students who are selected for the Math Competition Program. Mathletes will study many things including Number Theory, Counting, and Probability. This will develop a better understanding of math concepts, and prepare them for competition events.

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Robotics Club (Fee: \$150) (Initiation Based) Teacher: TBD

Weekday: TBD

First Lego League (FLL) is a robotics team which is designed to get children excited about science and technology; while teaching them valuable employment and life skills. A ten student team, that is guided by Parent Coaches, programs an autonomous robot (using a LEGO MINDSTORMS® robot set) scoring points on a thematic playing surface, while creating an innovative solution to a problem. <u>Parent participation is required.</u> The weekday team meeting will be held during club time. The weekend practice sessions will be held throughout the year. Students must be able to attend both weekday meetings and weekend practice sessions. Fees will go towards the kit, mats, supplies, registration, and competition fee. There is a selection process, starting with an online survey then an interview.

Simulated Congressional Hearing Club: Teacher: Mr. Koebe Weekday: Friday

The goal of this club is to promote civic competence and responsibility while evaluating, defending and presenting knowledge before a panel of judges. Club members will have the opportunity to work in cooperative teams where they will prepare and present statements before a panel of community representatives who act as congressional committee members. Teams will have the opportunity to represent Orlando Science-Technology Campus and will compete against other schools.

Stress-Free Zone Teacher: Ms. Bravo Weekday: Wednesdays

This club is designed to understand the causes, sources, and effects of stress and anxiety from an academic perspective. It will facilitate application of tools and techniques to identify, prevent, and manage stressors to improve academic success. Techniques may include: diet, exercise, emotional management, stress identification, understand positive stress, among other topics.

Comic Book Club Teacher: Mr. Lawrence Weekday: Mondays

Kapow! Wham! Boom! If you enjoy Marvel, DC Comics, Manga, or any kind of visual novels, this club is for you! We will read comic books, discuss the evolution, history, and characters. Students will create our own characters and comics.

Hispanic Heritage (Fee: \$15) Teacher: Ms. Bravo Weekday: Thursdays

This is a club designed to teach students about famous Hispanic Americans. They will explore aspects such as art, festivities, language, literature, and culture. These principals will be examined through games, scavenger hunts, crosswords, puzzles, arts and crafts, and simple food preparation.

Students who participate in the Science Olympiad club are expected to attend formal meetings <u>every Saturday</u>.

Additional fee may apply for State and National Tournaments.

To be eligible for the Duke TIP program and club, students must have scored at or above the 95th percentile on at least one subtest of a state or national standardized assessment taken in the past two years; <u>taken either their 5th or 6th grade year</u>, potentially both.
