





Chiari malformation (CM): Kee-AR-ee CM is a congenital anomaly in which two parts of the brain, the brainstem and the cerebellum, protrude through the opening at the base of the skull. Syringomyelin (SM): sear-IN-go-my-EEL-yn SM is a chronic spinal disorder in which cerebrospinal fluid enters the spinal cord, forming a cavity known as a syrinx.
