As stated before, this counts as a mandatory project for Grades 3-5, and not completing this will affect your child's grade.

Teachers will choose 5 class winners. Parents will also have the opportunity to come volunteer and help grade projects on Feb. 15th and 16th.

On February 17th, OSES will have their annual STEM fair! All students will get the chance to display their board. More details, along with a volunteer sign up will be sent out next week!

We had another fun filled week in Kindergarten! In Reading we have been working on retelling stories using facts and evidence from the text. We are also working on substituting sounds in words. Please continue to review ball sight words or speed reader phrases. Ms. McGee and Ms. Menoff's classes have been working on subtraction strategies in math. Ms. Haecherl and Ms. Yamnitz's classes have been finishing up their numbers to 100 in math. In Social Studies all classes learned about the holiday of Groundhog Day. Students learned about groundhogs and

made predictions about whether or not the groundhog would see his shadow on Thursday. In Science all students continued to work with day/night, the sun/ moon, and gravity. The 6th AR Window is currently open. Please help your child take AR quizzes at home to meet their goal of 4 points by February 22nd. We want to wish those Kindergarten students participating in the Curtis STEM Science Challenge at the Orlando Science Center on Saturday good luck! Also, later this month we will have our next Parent Teacher Conference Night, please watch out for further information about sign ups from your child's teacher. We hope everyone has a fantastic weekend!

1st Grade

It's been another busy week in first grade! In Ms. Swank's class for writing, the students used the writing process to create a 2paragraph writing comparing and contrasting themselves with a classmate. They also practiced asking questions and interviewing skills with this activity as well. In reading, our word study focused on words with the long /oo/ sound spelled oo and ue (blue, clue, moon, soon, etc.). We practiced the reading skills of comparing and contrasting and visualizing as we read fiction and nonfiction texts and poems. Through our stories, we explored and described how trees change throughout each season. We also looked at different

types of sentences (asking, telling, exclaiming, commanding), and combining sentences using the words and, but, and or. In science, we continued to explore living and nonliving things and plants. We did a plant experiment, as well as a few other STEM activities with Ms. Knight in preparation for the Curtis STEM challenge. On Tuesday and Wednesday, the students presented their African American Athletes trading cards to be displayed at African American Heritage Night. Each Friday of February, we will investigate an influential African American from history - starting this Friday with Ruby Bridges. In math, we finished chapter 7 studying money - using coins (quarters, nickels, dimes, and pennies) and telling time on an analog clock. Next we will begin chapter 8 on measuring length.

Ms. Anderson's class worked on many of the same reading, writing, math, and science skills as Ms. Swank's class.

This week Ms. Strickland's class did an author study of Mo Willems, practiced writing questions and persuasive paragraphs about "would you let the pigeon drive the bus." They also worked on vowel teams ai and ay. In math they studied 2D shapes and fractions. In science, they studied living and nonliving and things and in social studies they studied culture.

Mrs. Parker's class is finishing up and author study on Helen Lester, writing how to pieces with first, next, then steps. They are working on directions and directional words in social studies and starting measurement in math.

Second grade has been working hard on finishing up the Curtis Science Challenges. This week, they built telephones out of cups and string. They learned to appreciate cell service once they heard the clarity of cup phones.



Each class has also been working on the kindness challenge. Ms. Alfiky has been spear heading the collection of all the amazing acts of kindness. Core values day was a success and we can't wait to

We had a pep rally where students got to

meet Orbit the Orca, show their school spirit by performing cheers, learning more about the Core Values here at OSES. This week kindergarten students played a Abcya.com games to become familiar with letters sounds and how to write the letters by tracing. They also did some mouse practices on that. It was so much fun!

1st graders learnt how to insert shapes to create an image on Microsoft

Word. Students work to gain proficiency and speed using a word processor to write and illustrate with sentences, shapes and clipart.

2nd graders worked on PowerPoint project about community heroes. Students create a PowerPoint presentation identifying and discussing different community heroes such as police, firefighters, lifeguards, coaches, teachers, librarians, doctors, volunteers etc.

3rd graders worked on PowerPoint project about a planet of their choice.

5th graders started coding by using Code.org. Students will complete Course 2 or Course 3 which depends on their levels.











- 1. Go to http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp or search for HJ ESHARE in the app store (Apple and Android).
- 2. School Code: OSES2017 (case sensitive!)
- 3. Fill out the acknowledgement information.
- 4. Submit up to 10 pictures at a time. Once uploaded, you will be asked for the grade level of the student(s) in the picture. If it was a multi-grade event, such as Grandparents Night, just put K-2, 3-5, etc. If it is a single grade level, just put the number (1st grade = 1). It will also ask for the names of students and a brief description. If it is a class picture, you put "______'s Class" or "Grade Level." All fields must have something.

That's it! The deadline to submit pictures will be sometime in March. But please do not wait until the last minute, as I'd like to work on the book throughout the year.
