## Kindergarten

Kindergarten is getting back into the swing of things and ready to take on the last quarter of the year! All classes have been working on studying culture in social studies. In science, the students are learning about sinking and floating. Ms. Menoff's and Ms. McGee's class are finishing up their unit on double digit addition and subtraction. Ms. Haecherl's and Ms. Yamnitz's class are continuing to work on addition and word problems through 10.









In Ms. Swank's and Ms. Anderson's class in writing, the students used the writing process to write a newspaper article about their spring break. Our phonics study looked at prefixes and suffixes. In reading, we focused on fantasy stories and folk tales, including "The Hen, the Rooster, and the Bean", and "Go To Sleep, Gecko!" Our reading skill practice focused

on imagery and cause and effect. Our grammar focus skill was regular and irregular past tense verbs. In social studies we completed chapter 5 on "Our Past, Our Present", and students worked on creating timelines about their lives so far. In math, we began chapter II on geometry.

Parker's class we are focusing on sequencing events and patterns. We wrote about growing a garden while focusing on adverbs and studied pollination in science. In math we started adding and subtracting two-digit numbers by using place value.

April will be our last monthly celebration and our goal is for all second grade students to attend! Keep up the hard work at home and continue taking quizzes!

#### 5<sup>th</sup> Grade Math and Science

In Science the students in Ms. Hiatt's and Ms. Blaske's class are working on force and Newton's 3 Laws of Motion. They made paper helicopter and discovered the forces that make things fall how they can slow down the rate at which something falls? The students also conducted an experiment to see how forces can affect motion. Students observed the reaction of a marble when it was pushed into a stationary marble. The students also learned more about non-contact forces including magnetism.









In Math the students are working on measurement and data. They made line plot graphs with fractions. Now they are working on finding the perimeter, area, and volume of rectangular prisms.









#### Study Island at Home



#### Singapore Math Club

Singapore Math takes a slightly different mathematical approach than what you may be used to. It revolves around several key number- sense strategies: building number sense through part-whole thinking, understanding place value, breaking numbers into decomposed parts or friendlier numbers, ones that are easier to work with in the four operations (addition, subtraction, multiplication and division).


Singapore Math does something dramatically different when it comes to word problems. It relies onmodel drawing, which uses units to visually represent a word problem. Students learn to visualize what a word problem is saying so they can understand the meaning and thus how to solve the problem.

This week in club the students worked on a model drawing website called Thinking Blocks. They each had a Chrome Book to answer word problems in: addition and subtraction, multiplication and division, fractions, and ratios and proportion. They even used the interactive board to work on their Thinking Blocks.



- 1. Go to <a href="http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp">http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp</a> or search for HJ ESHARE in the app store (Apple and Android).
- 2. School Code: OSES2017 (case sensitive!)
- 3. Fill out the acknowledgement information.
- 4. Submit up to 10 pictures at a time. Once uploaded, you will be asked for the grade level of the student(s) in the picture. If it was a multi-grade event, such as Grandparents Night, just put K-2, 3-5, etc. If it is a single grade level, just put the number (1st grade = 1). It will also ask for the names of students and a brief description. If it is a class picture, you put "\_\_\_\_\_\_\_'s Class" or "Grade Level." All fields must have something.

That's it! The deadline to submit pictures is <u>Friday, April 7th</u>. But please do not wait until the last minute, as I'd like to work on the book throughout the year.
