## **KINDERGARTEN**

## FIRST GRADE

This week Mrs. Beckman's class is reading the story "Gus Takes the Train" and learning about adjectives! In math, we are learning about subtraction strategies. Don't forget that September's homework will be due on **Monday**, **October 1st!**

As a class, students learned the value of teamwork and respect through a STEM challenge. They had to build a 12 inch structure, as a team, to help support a giraffe to reach its food. They did great!

## SECOND GRADE

Second grade is going to see *Junie B. Jones is Not A Crook* next week **Tuesday September 25th**.

This week we learned the effect air has on apples in science and also experimented with different liquids to see which liquid works best keeping an apple from turning brown. This week we continued working on our Hispanic Heritage projects in class and hope to see all of our families next week for Hispanic Heritage night on the **27th**.

## **THIRD GRADE**

Ms. Hurley's class completed their floats! Students worked very hard and will present them at next week's Great Travel Fair. Our class will be doing research about Colombia this week in honor of Hispanic Heritage Month. Ms. Hurley will be sending out information this week about how parents can help with donations for both events. We began our Science unit on the Universe and it is amazing how much the students already know! Don't forget that if your last reading log was about a fiction book, this next one needs to be about a non-fiction book! We have been working on not blurting out in class. Ask your child to tell you about the story <u>My</u>. <u>Mouth is a Volcano</u>!

Mrs. Anderson's friends finished their Great Travel Fair projects as well. We continued our novel study of Charlie and the Chocolate Factory and compared Wonka's factory to Chocolate Kingdom. We have also finished up on arrays in multiplication and are continuing to practice our fact fluency, in preparation for our Multiplication Ice Cream party happening in a couple months.

## FOURTH GRADE

Fourth grade has been hard at work this week! Mrs. Michaud's class had a great time using the class Chromecarts during Reading! They have also continued their study of how to divide with 2 digit divisors, their novel study of Wonder, and their study of cause and effect relationships. Mrs. Colon's class is busy preparing for Hispanic Heritage Celebration! We created sculptures out of bread and will be painting them this week. We also made and tested model boats during Science class and learned 3 strategies to divide numbers during Math class.

As a reminder, all chaperones for our upcoming field trip to the Pirate Dinner Adventure must submit their payment of \$26 by **Friday, September 28.** Permission slips to St. Augustine were passed out this week and are due **November 9**. Fourth grade will also be participating in our first Drop Everything and Write next Tuesday. This is designed to simulate the conditions of the FSA; the results will be shared with parents to help all students succeed in Writing.

## FIFTH GRADE

The student in Ms. Blaske's class are learning about the states of matter. The students worked in groups to discuss the different ways to separate objects in a mixture. They came up with some creative answers. The students will be working on a solubility lab to test which materials dissolve in water, and a temperature lab to see what happens to a balloon when it is heated and cooled.

The permission slip and payment for the Sanford Zoo field trip is due **Monday, September 24**. Students going on the field trip need to bring their lunch in a Zip-Lock bag. Students need to be in full uniform for the field trip.







In Ms. Jensen's class, students learned about different ways to increase the rate of solubility. They made supersaturated solutions of water and borax, and on Monday they will see what happens when a supersaturated solution has time to cool!









### SIXTH GRADE

In Spanish, we had our Spanish Speaking Map test on Tuesday. The rest of this week we will be working on our Pinata projects. We are going to build one Pinata per class. We are promoting a teamwork environment... (Look out for Pictures in our next newsletter!)







Ownership for my actions: We want the students to take responsibility of their own behavior and the consequences of it. When we accept responsibility for our own actions or failures, we develop self-respect and respect for others. We all make mistakes and poor choices sometimes, accepting we did it and the consequences of it, that is taking ownership for our actions.

Respect myself and others: Respect is thinking and acting in a positive way about yourself or others.

Showing respect to someone means you act in a way that shows you <u>care</u> about their feelings and wellbeing. Showing respect for others include things like not calling people mean names, treating people with courtesy, caring enough about yourself that you don't do things you know can hurt you.

<u>Caring for my community</u>: Children learn caring and respect when they are treated that way. When our children feel loved, they also become attached to us. A person who is concerned about others and who does kind things for them no matter the <u>differences</u> compared with you is an example of someone who would be described as caring.

We are surrounded by people from different cultures, with different traditions and believes, people with different skin color and with different abilities, people that learn different than others and have different opinions than others. Understanding and respecting all those differences and make people feel <u>safe</u> no matter how different they are, is one of our goals at OSS.


