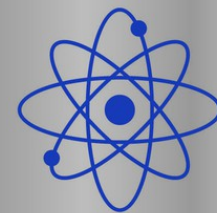
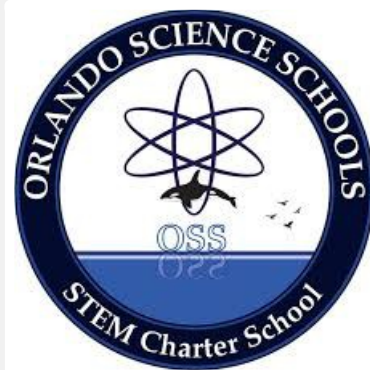

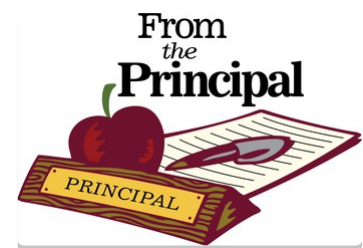


PRINCIPAL'S CORNER

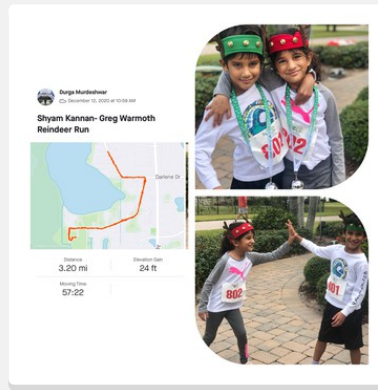


WINTER BREAK!

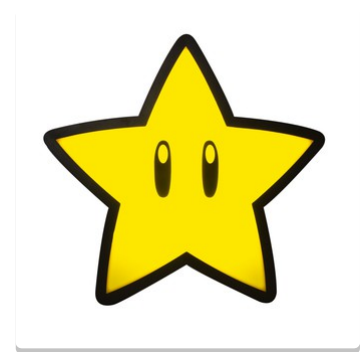
