SATURDAY LEADERSHIP ACADEMY

Dear OSS Family Members,

Saturday Leadership Academy (SLA) is a tradition at Orlando Science Technology Campus that helps prepare our students for the upcoming state testing. Beginning Saturday, February 6th, students in grades 3-6 are invited to attend SLA for additional support for the upcoming FSA. On each of the designated Saturdays, students will have a chance to get more in-depth instruction with standards they are struggling with and take several practice tests/quizzes in preparation for FSA.

This year, there are two different ways to attend SLA. Students can sign up to attend on campus or virtually. It does not have to be the same learning model that students attend during the week.

COVID-19 protocols will be the same as they are during the school week. Students and staff will be socially distanced and required to wear masks while on campus. Sanitation stations are also available around the school. For more information on the school's Health and Safety prevention measures, please contact the school.

For our students that attend on campus, complimentary snacks will be offered during their break and pizza will be provided for lunch. Students may also dress casually on these days.

SLA hours (virtually and on campus) are from 9:00am – 12:00pm in Building 2. Students may be dropped off between 8:30 - 9:00 a.m. and picked up between 12:00 - 12:30 p.m. from the Building 2 Cafeteria. Code of Conduct must be followed. <u>Any violations of these policies may result in your student's dismissal from the program.</u>





Justin (6th), Jayden (3rd), and Jordan (K) had fun baking cookies with their friends this Winter Break





SIXTH
