
FIFTH


Congratulations to everyone for making it through the first quarter! We hope everyone has a wonderful break!

Ms. Calabrese's class this week has been working on practicing persuasive and cover letters by having students apply to be an assistant in the class. They have also started their Holocaust novel study, which the students have been enjoying reading about. We have had some good conversations! In social studies, students wrapped up learning about Native Americans by creating a Wampum coding bracelet with beads. In science, students wrapped up learning about force and energy and created snow this week to review about states of matter and also practice their descriptive writing skills. Lastly, in math students have been learning about decimals, fractions, and reviewing order of operations and volume by creating order of operation trees and cities using volume and nets.

This week in 5th grade, some students have engaged in a variety of winter and holiday themed activities! Ms. Fralish's Science classes tested the dissolving rates of candy canes in water, oil, and hydrogen peroxide. After 10 minutes of soaking in each liquid, the class determined that in most trials, water dissolved the candy cane the fastest. The graph included shows the 14 trials, conducted by the students. A score of 3 represents dissolving the candy cane the fastest, 2 the next fastest, and finally 1 the slowest. In Ms. Fralish's math class, students are learning concepts behind multiplying and dividing fractions by relating different fractions to one another. The students created a "fraction tree" and discussed how the fractions are related to one another.









In Ms. Brown's class, we finished the unit on integration of knowledge and ideas, wrote adventure short stories, and learned about New England colonies.


history in 7 different areas and cultures of the world. We still have a lot to learn, so rest up. Happy Holidays to all!
