

FROM YOUR TEACHERS

KINDERGARTEN

This week in Kindergarten we had a great time reading Goldilocks and The Three Bears, we had a fun creating our own bear chairs out recycled materials. We also explored fish and made observations this week! We really enjoyed seeing live fish on Thursday!:)

Students have been enjoying Science and discovering how we classify and describe objects. They are working hard at becoming great readers by reading nightly and taking AR quizzes.

THIRD

Students learned more about the Golden Gate Bridge this week. They also did their first STEM experiment this week in class, building a bridge that would hold pennies. Please continue to work on memorizing multiplication facts.

Honesty is the character trait of the month for September. Students have learned about primary sources this week, and how important it is to be honest, as you are the eye witness to an event.

Remember, your student needs to have 11 AR points by September 30th. Students are required to take 1 AR Test per week, as stated in our Class Handbook.

FIFTH

This week in Ms. Brown's 5th grade ELA & Social Studies class, students completed the Craft Writing unit and took writing assessments with a writing prompt regarding a person who travels back in time. Students also completed the Informational: Key Ideas and Details reading unit and are taking an assessment on the reading "A Record-Breaking Meal: Python Found with Three Deer in its Stomach" by Miami Herald. We have learned about natural disasters in both social studies and in reading where we read "Wild Weather" (Journeys p. 654).

SIXTH

If you were not able to secure a spot for Parent-Teacher Conferences, be sure to watch the recorded version. It will answer a lot of your questions.

In **World History** we continue with our study of Mesopotamia and the Fertile Crescent. This will keep us busy through the end of the month. For Press's class, be sure to research your What in the World? Timeline project entry!

Mrs. Gajus' Math Classes: This week, Pre-Algebra students finished up their unit on Exponents and Scientific Notation. They have now learned how to work with rational and irrational numbers, exponential expressions, and numbers written in scientific notation. We will be moving into lines and equations in Unit 3. Math 6 Advanced students had their quiz on Proportional Relationships this week. They will now be moving into the part of the unit covering Unit Rates. Math 6 students took their quiz on Rates this week and will be moving into learning how to convert fractions, decimals, and percents. This is just a reminder that Quarter 1 is over on October 9th. Please remind your student to be checking OSES Connect for grades to see how they are performing in each class and what missing assignments might still need to be submitted.

Our IL PE teacher Ms. Scales came out on Wednesday to videotape "Mexican Hat dance" with our on campus 4th grade students.

STEM Face to Face Learners

Our Face Learners have completed a civil engineering challenge this week... building bridges! Our 2nd -5th grade learners used straws and tape to build a bridge that would support over 200 grams in weight! I was impressed with their problem solving skills as these engineers created a bridge that would cross the six inch gap while also supporting weight. Our Kinder-1st graders completed a similar challenge using hands-on manipulatives, creating a bridge that would fit across a 6-inch gap while also supporting a toy elephant! This relates back to a story we read together in class, "21 Elephants and Still Standing," which is about a circus crossing the Brooklyn Bridge to prove its strength. Great job to our civil engineers!

STEM Innovative Learners

Innovative STEM students also created bridges that would support weight, but had the extra challenge of testing different materials to see which material available at home would best work for their bridge design. Students were challenged to see how much weight their bridges could hold, as well! Using a variety of different materials means each bridge may hold a different weight. Great work, bridge builders!
