We had our first full week back after the winter break and we are still enjoying getting back into the swing of things. This week in kindergarten we worked on manipulating beginning sounds in reading. We also practiced our inferring and connecting skills while reading various books. In math we are working on place value and numbers to 100. We are also learning how to skip count by 2's, 5's, and 10's. In

both social studies and science we have continued working on our new units. We are working on describing where we live in social studies and using different map skills to identify various places. In science we are working on gravity and students learned what would happen if there was more or less gravity acting upon them. Ms. Menoff's class did a STEM experiment on rollercoasters to explore various concepts of gravity.

1st Grade

In Ms. Swank and Anderson's class they learned about author's purpose. The worked on sequencing in Writing and answered the following prompt: One day I looked out the window, and saw marshmallows falling from the sky. They learned about compound

words and abbreviations. In math, they started a unit on Money and learned how to count coins. In Science, they studied force in motion. In Ms. Anderson's class they talked about character education in social studies.

Mrs. Parker's class is finishing up force and motion

with a fun push/pull experiment using cars and rubber bands and different kinds of friction. We have been working hard on word study and building our word wall. In reading this week we were talking about problems and solutions of a story to help us retell what we read.

Second grade has hit the ground running as we started the New Year! Ms. Alfiky's class has been focusing on improving their writing skills by paying close attention to sentence fluency, correct punctuation, and overall cohesiveness of their paragraphs. All four second grade classes completed the play dough STEM activity from the Curtis Young Science Challenge this week. Students had to make high quality play dough using water, flour, and salt. They worked in partners to complete the task, and each tested their designs to make adjustments in their recipes to improve their creations. Next week, Ms. Alfiky's class will be designing a system that will reduce water runoff into a lake from a nearby "city." Mrs. Nelson, Ms. Haines, Mrs. Bonnell and Ms. Alfiky are all very proud of all of our second graders for continuing to work hard. Thank you to the parents who attended the award ceremony last night.

Ms. Thomas' class had an amazing week! In order to prepare for our upcoming lesson on the Civil War, we have been discussing the main ideas and themes of the Dred Scott vs. Sandford Supreme Court decision in Reading. In Math, we started a new unit on two-dimensional figures. In



Science, we took our Chapter 3 assessment. In Writing we have been discussing effective ways to write an informative prompt.

Ms. Hurley's class started the new year off with some fun math and reading new year themed review centers. They tested on unit 3 in both sci-

ence and social studies this week. They started their new class read aloud, The Phantom Tollbooth. The students are very excited about

the book and have been enjoying it immensely. In math they have returned to using the Everyday Math curriculum and are diving in to the unit on complex fractions.

Congratulations to Udeshya Singla for winning 1st place and Aaditya Jandhyala for winning 3rd place in the bee.










mystery of who was





- 1. Go to http://www.hjeshare.com/eShare/Index.jsp or search for HJ ESHARE in the app store (Apple and Android).
- 2. School Code: OSES2017 (case sensitive!)
- 3. Fill out the acknowledgement information.
- 4. Submit up to 10 pictures at a time. Once uploaded, you will be asked for the grade level of the student(s) in the picture. If it was a multi-grade event, such as Grandparents Night, just put K-2, 3-5, etc. If it is a single grade level, just put the number (1st grade = 1). It will also ask for the names of students and a brief description. If it is a class picture, you put "______'s Class" or "Grade Level." All fields must have something.

That's it! The deadline to submit pictures will be sometime in March. But please do not wait until the last minute, as I'd like to work on the book throughout the year.
