## Kindergarten

Kindergarten has been learning all about Veterans this week in preparation for the Veterans Day celebration on Friday. Classes have completed crafts to display and learned a song to sing as we welcomed Veterans into our

## 2nd Grade

This week Mrs. Nelson's class enjoyed a STEM activity as a prize for winning the 2nd grade Red Ribbon Week poster contest! Students were given three strips of paper, three straws, and tape, and used these items to

create an object that would stay in the air the longest. Students later learned about the engineering process, the acceleration of gravity, and air resistance, and discussed how each of these related to their activity.


This week students also learned about Veterans Day. Students created patriotic agamorgraphs and wrote either a letter to veterans or a paragraph about veterans to accompany their paragraphs.

#### 1st Grade

This week First Grade has finished a lot of work! In Science this week, all classes learned about how living things use water. In Social Studies, we talked about how jobs that people do.

Ms. Swank's class learned about words with long U sound, the water cycle, and wrote narratives as rain drops traveling through the water cycle. They also wrote thank you letters to veterans for serving our country. In Math, they studied different strategies for 2 digit addition with regrouping.

In Ms. Anderson's class, they learned about plot, retelling stories and asking and answering questions. They also learned




about good, services, and matter and movement. In Math, they worked on 2 digit subtraction.

In Mrs. Parker's class, they discussed the voting process and are voting on their favorite things. They are still working on word problems to 20 in Math, and are building up their word wall by manipulating letters to make new words.

Ms. Strickland's class also learned about the voting process and participated in the Cookie Election to learn how to vote. They also learned about word endings, and wrote about what they would do if they were president. In Math, they completed a benchmark exam on counting, place value, and comparing numbers.





#### 3rd Grade

3rd has joined forces by pairing the classes up for our school-wide Character Education program. Mrs. Cybulski and Mrs. Silvares focused on Empathy this month by creating a graphic organizer-What does Empathy Look Like? Feel Like? While Ms. Kish and Ms. Murphee's classes are sending posters and cards to the Standing Rock cause in support of demonstrating empathy for the Sioux tribe in South Dakota.

Ms. Kish and Ms. Murphee are continuing to have their students master their multiplication facts by Nov. 22nd- reward- ice cream party!

All 4 classes are excited to share the Great Travel Fair (state projects) with the entire school in Dec. The students are working to gather facts about our wonderful 50 states!

Lastly, Ms. Kish's class completed their Unit on the Universe with stellar projects- 3d projects of the Sun, the Constellations or the Telescope. They were "out of this world!"

October was a fun filled busy month for our fifth graders! Our students enjoyed the fun activities during Red Ribbon Week, our field trip to the Orlando Science Center, as well as Stem Day.

During Red Ribbon Week, students wrote essays on how they would make their life story drug free. They enjoyed the themes for each day and were especially excited about the visits from the Orlando Police Department and local Fire Fighters. Students experienced what it was like to sit in the back of a police car, as well as being in the passenger and driver's seat where they took turns deafening our ears with the siren! It was fun to see the excitement on their faces and hear aspirations from different students who want to be a police officer or fire fighter one day.

Our first fifth grade Stem Day and field trip to the Orlando Science Center were a huge success as students conquered the challenges set before them.

During Stem Day, Ms. Hiatt's class had a Catapult Challenge where students made catapults and teams took turns launching mini marshmallows at a target. The variety of designs was impressive! At the Orlando Science Center, students worked on stem challenges, such as bridge building, and making paper airplanes to maneuver through a target to land at a certain distance. There was also time left over to enjoy some of the exhibits, including the Hurricane Tube, Making Clouds, Wave Maker, Vortex and Velocity Bowl, and Wind Tunnel. Ms. Blaske's class will continue investigating space and has started a science project on Planets, while Ms. Culverwell's class has commenced their PLTW Robot Research.

While focusing on story elements, character traits, summarizing and text evidence, Ms. Hiatt's class got messy and creative completing their Pumpkin Book Report Project. Each student had the challenge to turn a pumpkin into a character from a

book they chose to do their report on and the results were impressive! It was a heart-warming experience to watch how students teamed together to assist each other with their pumpkin character by sharing materials, and collaborating on ideas together.

Falling in tune with the excitement of the 2016 Presidential Election, Ms. Farrel and Ms. Hiatt's classes studied the Electoral College, learned what a swing state is, and made predictions of what the outcome of the election would be by state. Fourteen students in Ms. Hiatt's morning class and 16 students in her afternoon class predicted at or above 80% of the actual outcome per state for the election. Of those, 3 students predicted 49 out of the 50 states correctly! It seems they have what it takes to be Pollsters for our Nation!:)













## **Specials: Young Music Makers!**



This week Kindergarten is using their listening skills to tell if the pitch is higher or lower and placing the sticker in either direction. Then needing to place the numbers I through 10 in order that go with the 1,2 Buckle My Shoe Song.

Ist grade students have been asked "Why is it important to memorize music?" They are understanding that it makes them better musicians and leads to a better performance. With their own performance of Mary had a Little Lamb.

2nd grade is presenting their Culturally Diverse Celebrations. They have chosen a country and a celebration that includes music to research and present to their fellow classmates. This way they see how music is used in everyday life.

3rd grade is starting a new unit called Evaluation. Learning how to evaluate a group that is playing a piece of music together as well as evaluating their own performance. In the upcoming weeks they will be learning a short piece of music and performing it to be evaluated by their fellow classmates.

4th grade has started their Part-Singing unit. Asking themselves "How can I maintain my part while others are singing a completely different part?" They will be discovering how to sing in rounds, canons, and Partner songs. While one group is singing one part there are two other groups singing 2 completely different parts.

5th grade is half way through their Music Dictation unit. They will need to recognize exact pitches that they hear and be able to transcribe it onto a piece of paper. This concept is very difficult for even the most advanced musician. They are getting ready to be tested on this concept at the end of the quarter.




