
Big THANK YOU to all the



3rd grade parents who helped assist with any event listed.We couldn't do it without YOU! What a week for 1st Grade! All of classes worked so hard even through the heat in our rooms. In Science, all of our classes learned about telescopes and magnifying glasses making objects look bigger. In Social Studies, we talked about need and wants and why we make choices.

Ms. Swank's and Ms. Anderson's classes finished their animal adaptations unit, and read and wrote words with ph and sh sounds. They also practiced reading skills of inferring and identifying rhyme scheme within a poem. For Math, they continued practicing 2digit addition with regrouping.

Mrs. Ortiz's class read and wrote words with ph and ck and practiced retelling stories. In Math, they continued practicing greater than, less than and equal too. Ms. Strickland's class finished their unit from last week practicing retelling story elements, and read and wrote words with tricky Y. In Math, they reviewed addition and subtraction strategies and fact families. They also celebrated Pumpkin Day by studying the life cycle of a pumpkin, making pumpkin playdoh, and looking inside a pumpkin to count the seeds.

### 2nd Grade

Mrs. Bonnell's class is learning about the different types of precipitation and evaporation in science! They have a weeklong experiment of a covered cup of water and an uncovered cup of water, and they are testing their hypotheses to see which one will have less water in it due to evaporation on Friday. They also did an experiment of quickly turning a liquid into a gas, also an example of evaporation. The materials the class used were a cup of lemonade (liquid) and a spoonful of baking soda (solid). The reaction between created a gas! In math, Mrs. Bonnell's class is learning about doubles and practicing basic addition and subtraction. In reading, they are learning about different animal features that help them survive.

Congratulations to all of the students who met their AR goal for September! Students had a blast last Friday at the AR Celebration! Students who met their goal chose between visiting a movie room where they watched a movie and enjoyed a snack, a home electronics room where they played on electronic devices with their friends, and a science room where they made and played with slime. Two of our second grade classes had every student meet their goal! Our new recording period began on September 29th and ends on October 25th. 




### **Specials: Physical Education**





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
