Quick Reminders!

Pick-Up should not arrive on campus before the times shown below:

Grades K-5: 2:40 p.m.

Grades 6-7: 2:20 p.m.

Both Pick-Up and Drop-Off follow the same car loop shown below. Please remember that we are all in this together; kindness and respect are both important.

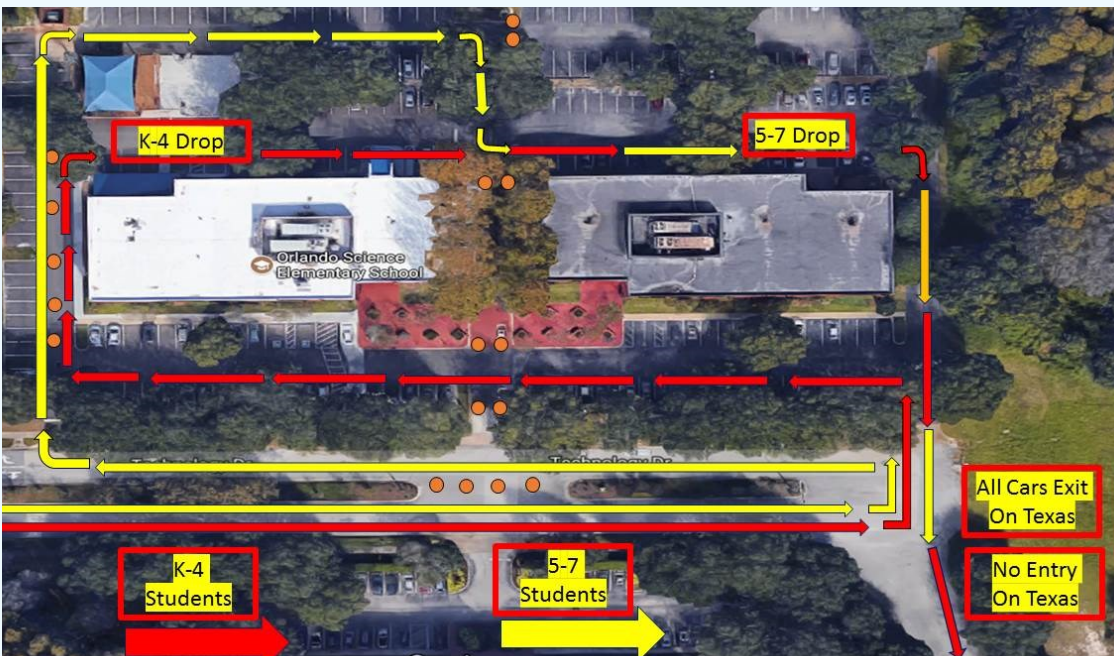
Students may be on campus without penalty until 4 p.m., you have the time range of 2:20 to 4 p.m. to pick up your student.

Students cannot be picked up from the Front Desk after 2 p.m. If you need to check your child out after this time arrangements must be made with Mr. Singleton directly. Students may not be checked out to avoid the carline.

Parents should not be coming to the Pick-Up Area holding signs out of their vehicles. Students are released directly to their vehicles. Parents that walk for Pick-Up will be directed to the Front Office.

Kindergarten

This week's weekly theme was "Friends" and our focus this week is about friendship. This is important life skill that children need to have in our world. This week we read "Huggapotamus" by Steve Metzger. Throughout the week we learned how to make good friends, how to treat our friends, and to be kind. We also learned that we are all unique in our own way and that we should all be friends no matter what!

We continued learning about 3-Dimensional shapes! We also made connections with everyday items that we use that are 3-D shapes. At the end of the week we used play-dough to create our own 3-D shape! Some of us came up with some pretty cool shapes that test the laws of math!

1st Grade

This week Mrs. Parker's class is working on five senses in science. We are discussing the responsibilities of a good classroom citizen in social studies and in Language arts we are writing in our journals and reading stories about children who go to school and what they need to succeed. We took our first spelling test and all did a fantastic job.

Ms. Dyer's class was introduced to their class jobs this week. They are learning how to be responsible citizens. This ties into their social studies unit which is all about citizenship! Last week they competed in another stem challenge working to save Freddy!

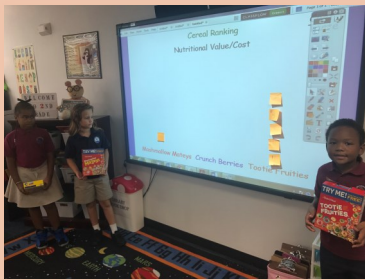
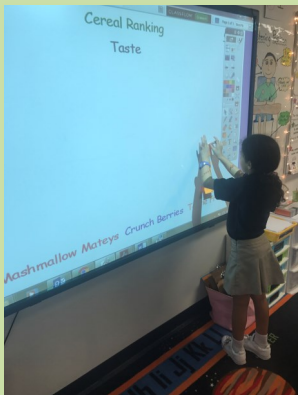
Miss Fisher's class had a wonderful week learning about scientists and making observations during our science lessons. We also became familiar with weekly routine center rotations in reading and math.

This week in Mrs. Duran's class we how character feelings change in stories. We worked on number concepts including place value and expanded form. We launched our Families Project Based Learning (PBL) and learned how families can be the same and different. We also used the iPads to show our thinking in word maps!



2nd Grade

In 2nd grade, we are learning about how scientists are able to compare observations made by different groups. We were asked to choose cereals for a school cafeteria based on their nutritional value and cost. We concluded that Tootie Fruities were the best choice, with only 8 grams a of sugar per serving and at a cost of 49 cents a serving. But wait, there's a twist! Then we received another letter asking us to rank the cereals by taste. Lucky us! Seconds graders still chose Tootie Fruities, commending its bright colors and sweet taste. It's hard work being a scientist!



3rd Grade

This week 3rd grade focused on rounding, place value, and one-digit multiplication. They learned about the scientific method and began talking about maps. Mrs. Silvers' class began making paper mache globes and will finish painting them and drawing the continents later next week. In ELA, they have been learning about plot features and are drawing a plot roller coaster to demonstrate the various parts of the plot.



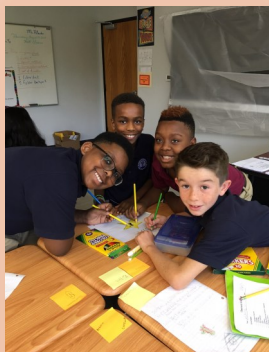
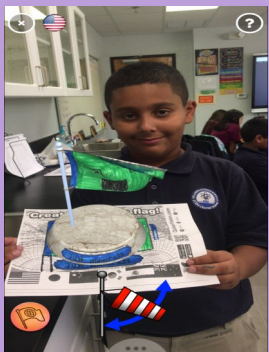
4th Grade

6th Grade

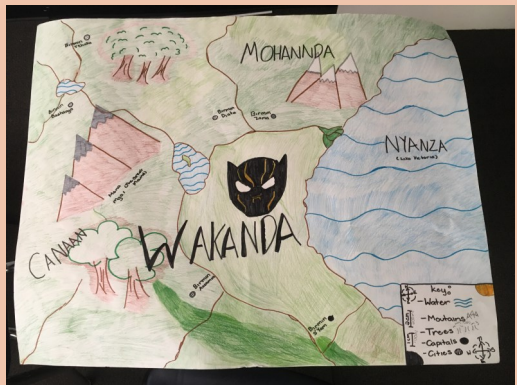
Take a look at what some of our 6th grade classes did this week!
