3rd Grade

Third grade is working very hard on our AR goals . Mrs. Sokoloff and Ms. Nieradka's classes having been working on fractions. They have made fraction quilts, number lines, and tiles. Many classes had fun with our M&M fraction math project. Mrs. Silvares' class did a research project on the influence of Spanish colonization on Florida. They then worked with a partner to make a poster and present it.





4th Grade

In Reading, Mrs. Michaud's class has focused on identifying how authors prove their arguments in text. In Math, Mrs. Michaud's class has discussed finding the volume of rectangular prisms. In Science, they discussed how humans use renewable and nonrenewable resources, and in Social Studies they learned about the Seminole Wars. Don't forget Mrs. Michaud's small Valentine treat exchange will be taking place from Feb 1-Feb 14, with formal Valentines to be exchanged on Valentine's Day.

Mr. Rego's class continued to work hard on equivalent fractions and solving for area and perimeter in Math. In Reading, they focused on determining the theme of a poem. They also discussed figurative language, how to identify it, and then they practiced writing similes.

5th Grade

In Mrs. Berray's 5th grade classes, students have been working on a project on the 13 colonies. Students chose their colony and have collaborated with other students to create a multi-media presentation to accompany their oral presentation. Presentations start next week on the 1st, so students have been hard at work to iron out their last wrinkles!

The students in Ms. Blaske's classes are learning about different types of energy. The students worked together to plan and built their own electrical circuits using a switch to light up a light bulbs or two.









6th/7th Grade





Students in both, World History and Art Elective with Ms. Kish, have just begun to scratch the surface learning about Greek Mythology.
