Student Pick-Up and Drop-Off Information

Quick Reminders!

Pick-Up should not arrive on campus before the times shown below:

Grades K-5: 2:40 p.m.

Grades 6-7: 2:20 p.m.

Both Pick-Up and Drop-Off follow the same car loop shown below. Please remember that we are all in this together; kindness and respect are both important.



Students may be on campus without penalty until 4 p.m., you have the time range of 2:20 to 4 p.m. to pick up your student.

Students cannot be picked up from the Front Desk after 2 p.m. If you need to check you child out after this time arrangements must be made with Mr. Singleton directly. Students may not be checked out to avoid the carline.

Parents should not be coming to the Pick-Up Area holding signs out of their vehicles. Students are released directly to their vehicles. Parents that walk for Pick-Up will be directed to the Front Office.

We understand that the logistics are challenging right now, but if we all follow procedures accordingly some of the frustrations can be avoided. With teamwork we can accomplish anything!

Please don't turn right around the cones when you leave the school.

Please don't block our neighbors driveway at the college across the street.

Club Dismissal Reminders:

Please ensure you know your students schedule (clubs/ tutoring) and the end times. If you are unsure of your students' club schedule please contact Ms. Santiago at Ana.Santiago@orlandoscience.org

Parents should arrive to pick up no earlier than 5 minutes before club ends.

Kindergarten has been having a blast this week with goals in reading to retell the story of the Three Little Pigs with the characters and setting.

In math we have been practicing our goal of counting to 120 by 1s, 5s, & 10s.

We completed our week learning about forces of matter and introducing map concepts!

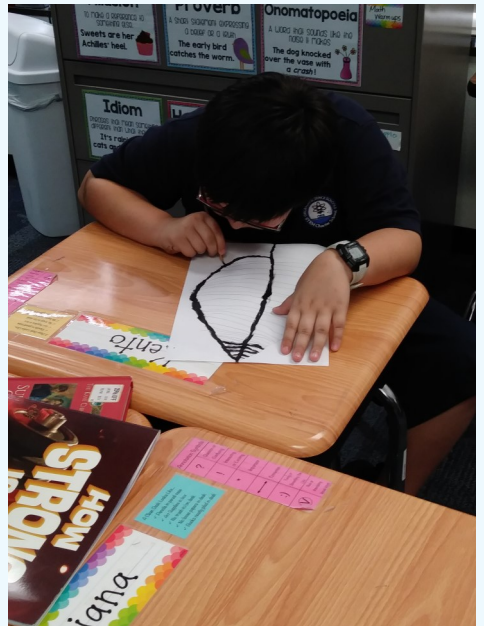
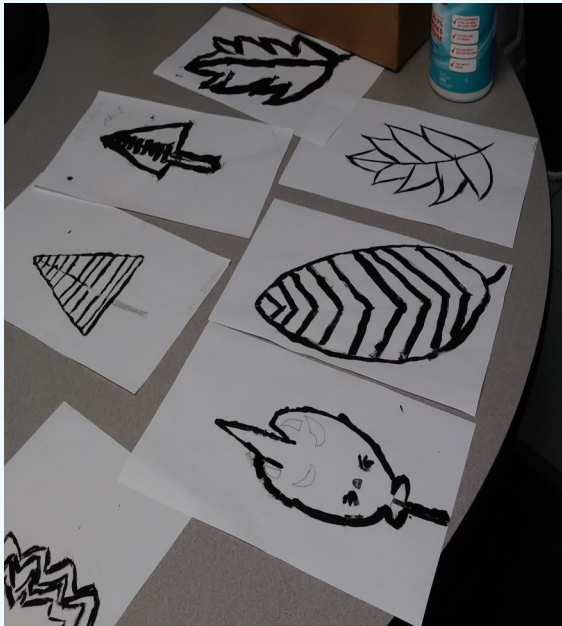
2nd Grade

In Ms. Chandler's 2nd grade class, we wrapped up our Science chapter this week on rocks, minerals, and soil. We ranked different brands of soil to use for a community garden in a STEM activity, observed rocks and minerals with a hand lens, and even made our own crystals. Rock on!



3rd Grade

This week 3rd Grade learned about why leaves turn colors in the Fall and they made their own painted leaves, using a contrast of warm and cool colors. They started multiplying with 2-digit numbers and have learned how to plot points on the coordinate plane. In ELA, they learned what figurative language is and how to identify figurative language in literature.



4th Grade

What a busy week in 4th grade! Ms. Alfiky's class enjoyed doing an experiment with fire this week! The experiment was designed to demonstrate the three elements needed to start a fire, with a special emphasis on oxygen. In Mrs. Michaud's class, students explored the properties and states of matter, culminating in an experiment involving surface tension! For the experiment, students counted the amount of drops of water that could fit on a penny before and after mixing the water with dish soap. Mrs. Michaud's class also completed their study of multi-digit division this week, took their Chapter 1 Social Studies test, and explored comparing and contrasting characters within a story. 4th grade would like to thank everyone who is volunteering their time for our upcoming field trip to the Orlando Repertory Theatre. 5th Grade

This week in 5th grade, Ms. Greene and Ms. Blaskie's homeroom have been studying immigration in reading, analyzing multiple perspectives on the topic of coming to America. The immigration unit project will be due Friday, October 20th. Today, Friday the 6th, all fifth grade students were able to participate in a STEM lesson provided by Orlando Science Center and OUC. Students built roller coasters and tested them using solar power! Last note, the AR celebration party will be moved to October 9th. 6th/7th Grade

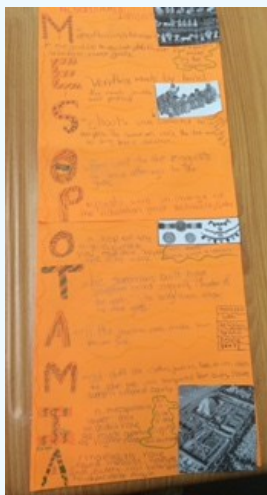
Ms. M has some rather dapper dress down participants for our Cancer Awareness Day! Check out two of her dressed up students!



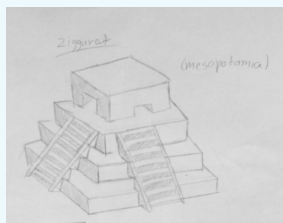

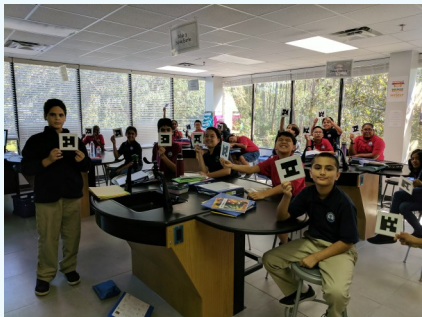




Ms. Piontkowski's class did a quiz using the Pickers cards, and started a lab today on building physical models.
