FIRST GRADE

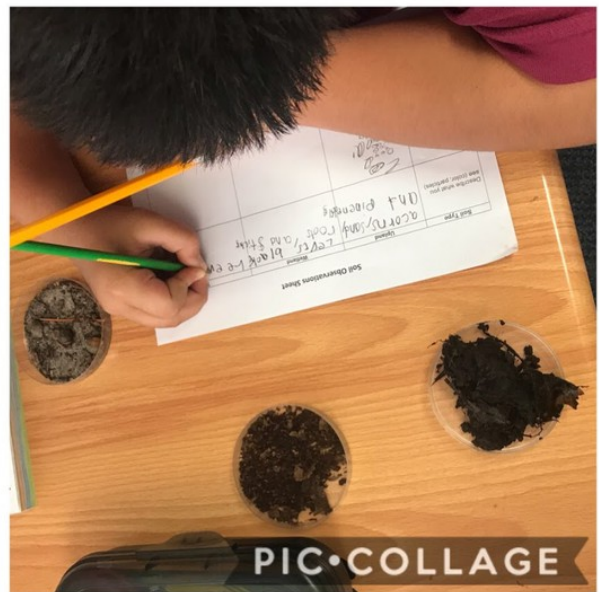
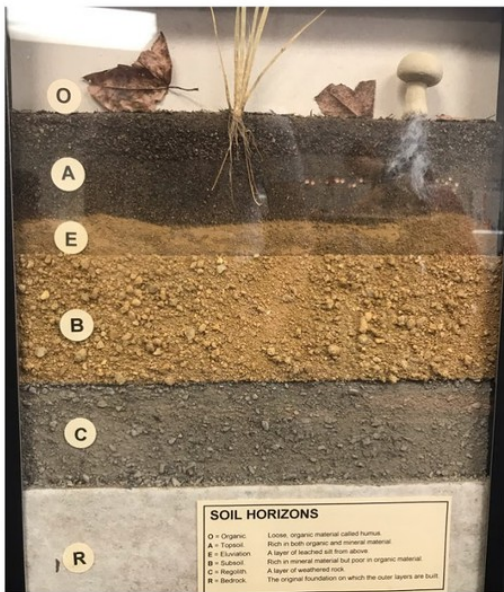
First grade had a great time on our Field Trip to Orlando Repertory Theater. We were dazzled by performance and ended the day with a wonderful picnic lunch outside.

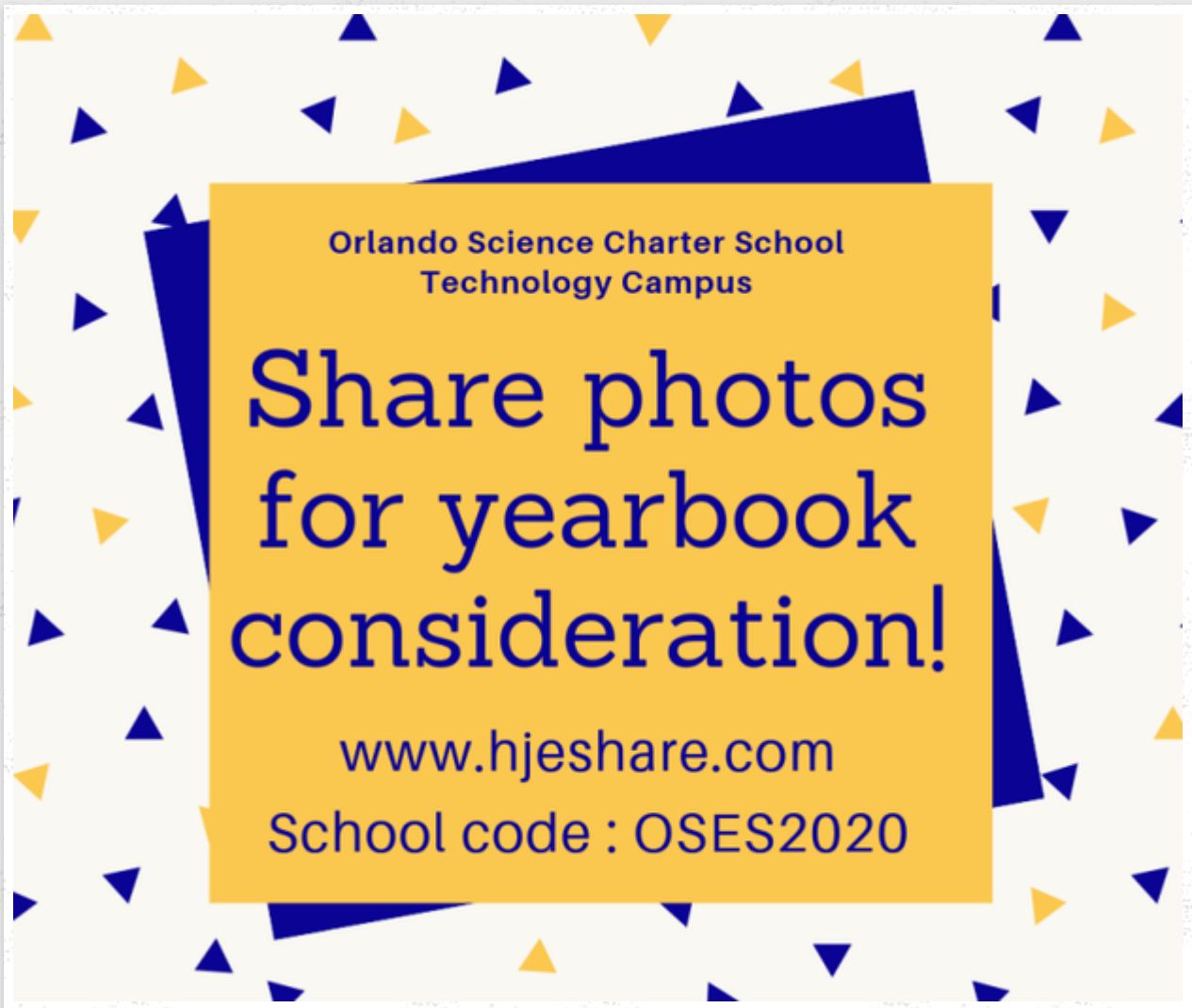

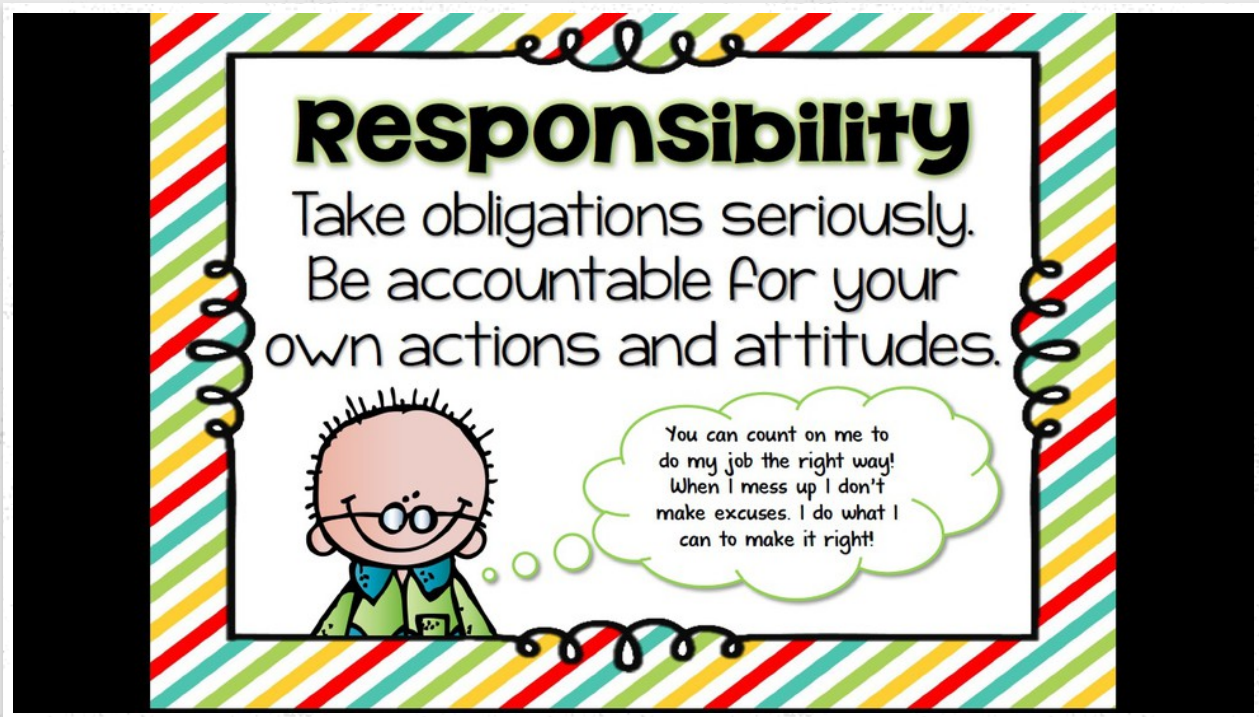
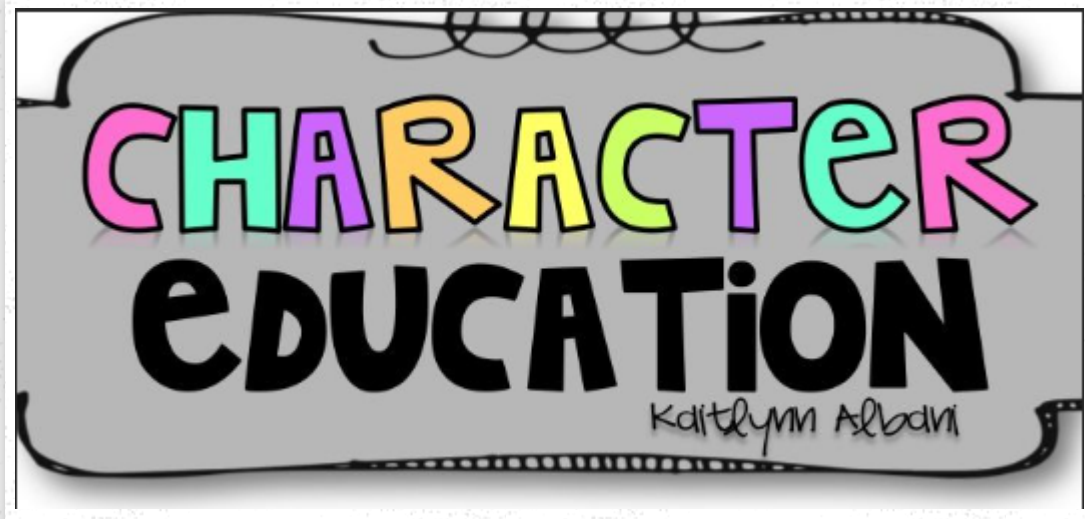
