1. We need YOUR help! The OSS PVO is asking the OSS parents to [sign up to volunteer](#) and help at the Fall Festival on Friday, November 1st and Saturday AND/OR November 2nd. 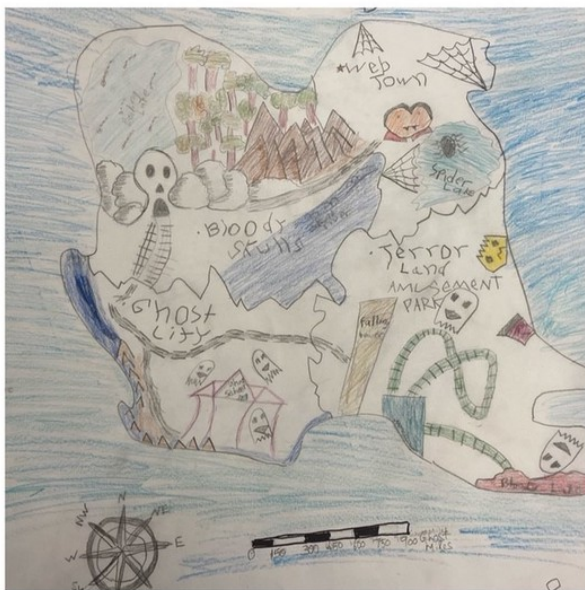
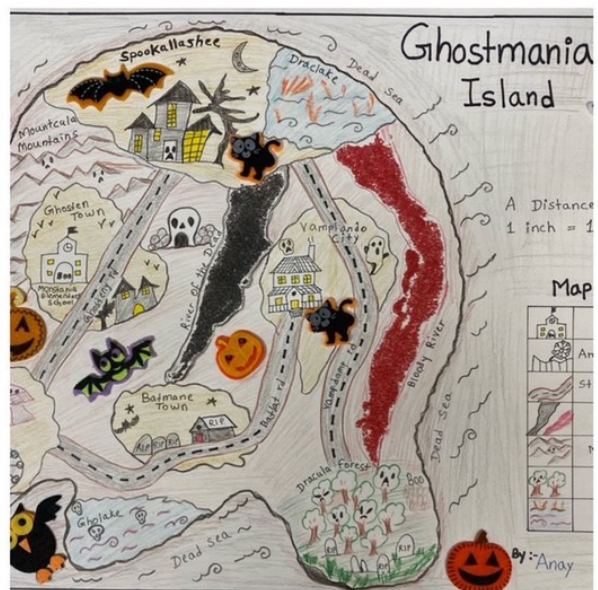
We finished our week having a Spooktacular STEM Day! We had a great time learning the human skeleton, force and tension with spider web bridges and the science behind slime!!!!

In Mrs. Waugh's Social Studies class, students finished up a geography unit by making spooky maps following a rubric. They were very creative and super spooky!



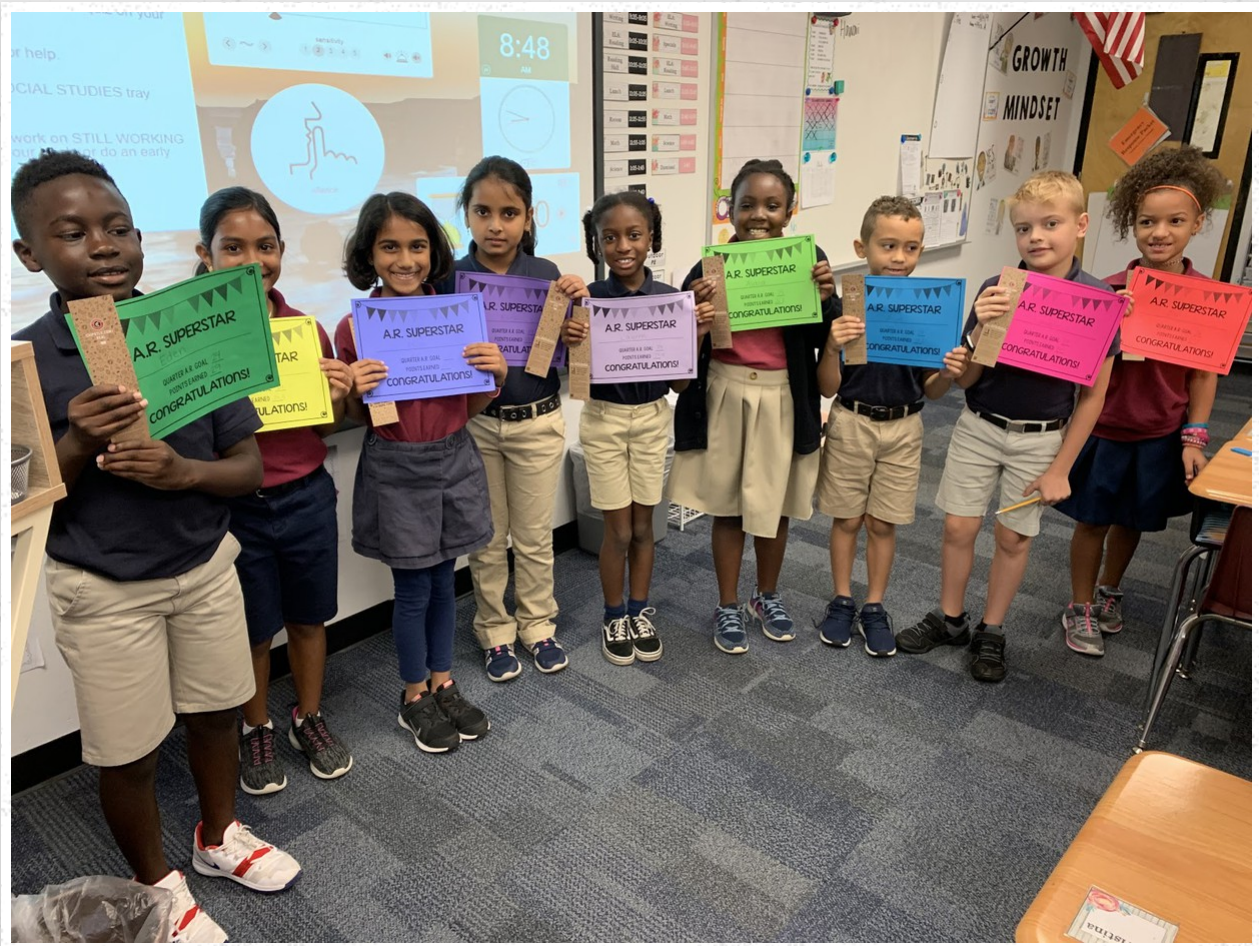
THIRD GRADE

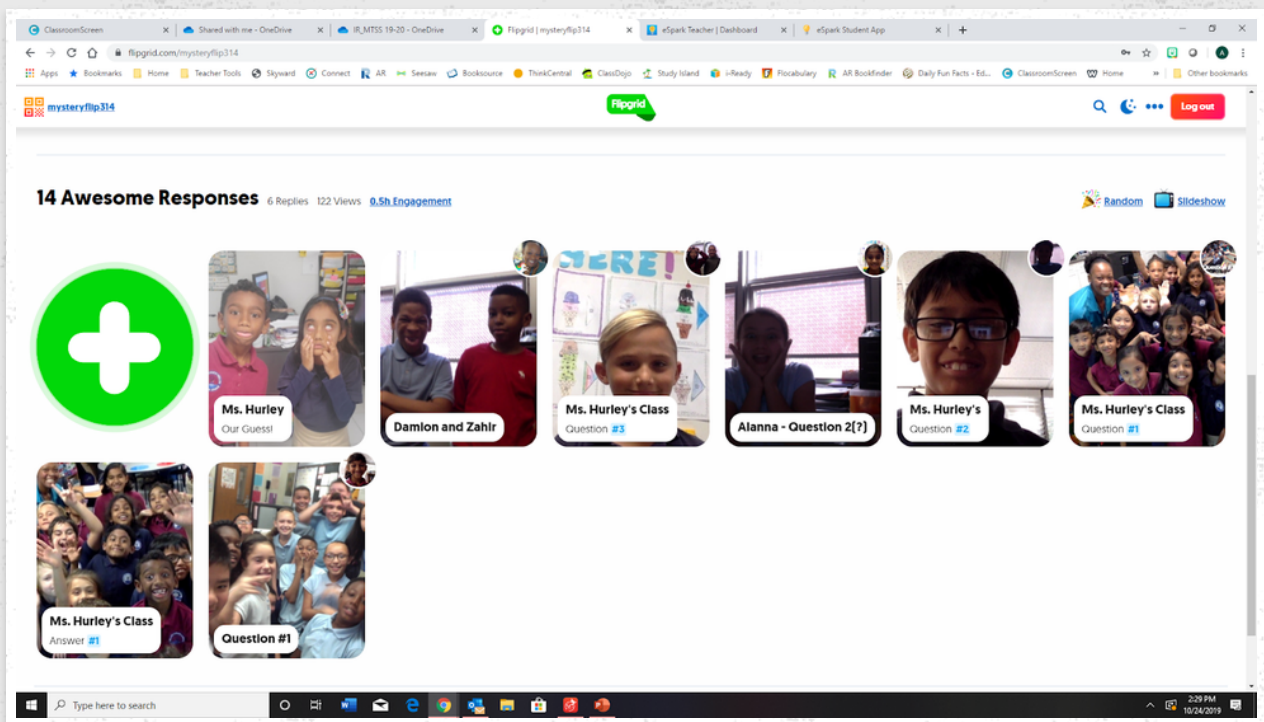

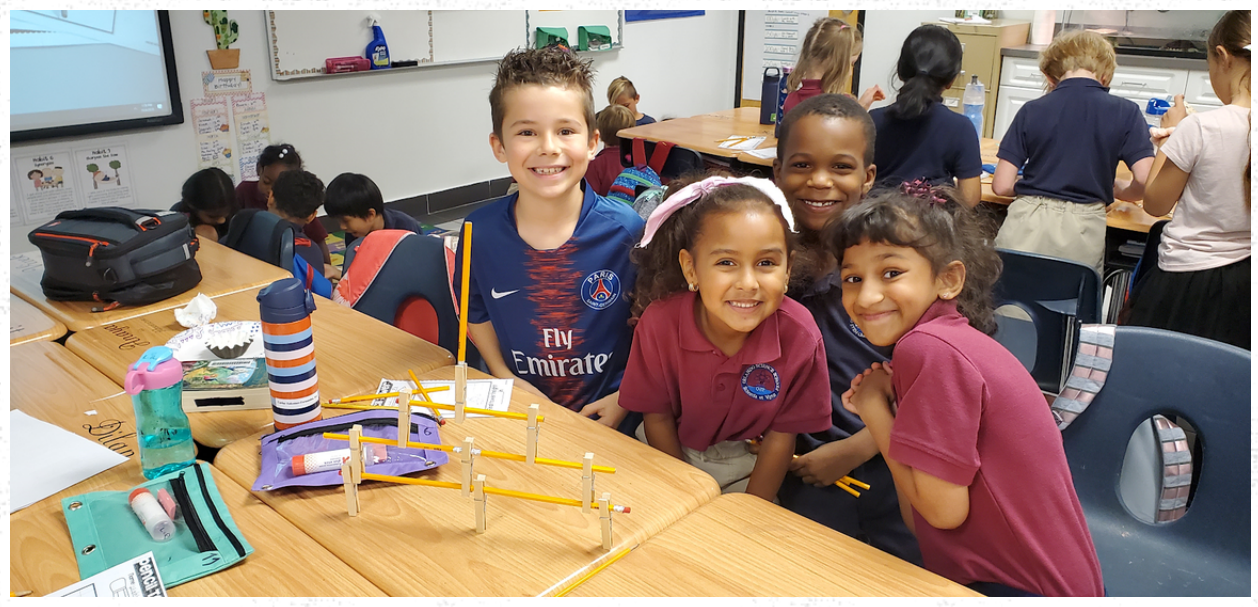
Here are our AR superstars for this quarter:

We also have been having a blast completing STEM challenges with our STEM Buddies.





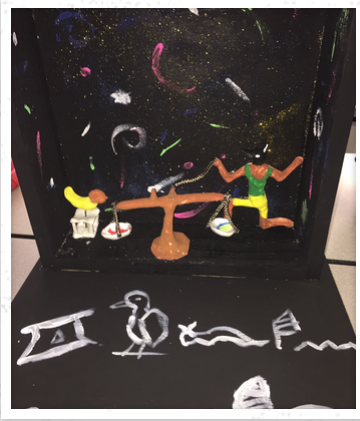

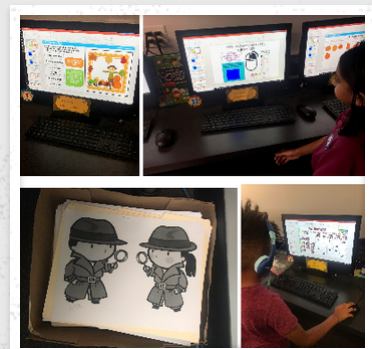
In World History this week, 6th grade has shared research projects on Ancient Egypt. Here are just a few examples of the excellent work we saw this week.

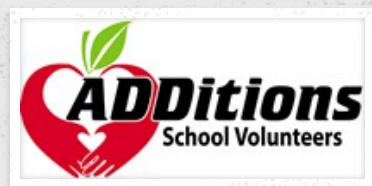



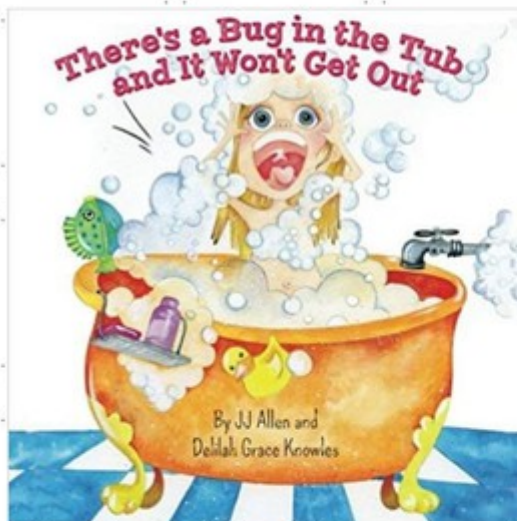
