

Next week, all fifth grade students will be participating in an ELA benchmark test. This will not be for a grade, but will be important to design instruction.

SIXTH GRADE

Pre-Algebra students have spent the last couple of weeks learning how to solve multi-step equations. This week, they began learning about graphing equations and solving systems of equations using various methods. This is the last skill in Unit 2 and the Unit 2 Test will be

coming up soon. 6/7 math students finished up Unit 2 this week and are beginning Unit 3 about expressions and equations. They will learn how to generate equivalent expressions and how to solve equations/inequalities. We will also work with some graphing concepts as well. Please make sure you are encouraging your students to check OSES Connect regularly to track their progress in class and to ensure they have no missing assignments. We will also be taking Benchmark #2 in December. I am looking forward to seeing how much the students have grown this semester!


RED RIBBON WEEK

This Week we celebrated red ribbon week and had different dress up days to send a message about being drug free. We also had a visit from the fire department and the police mounted unit team.






















SUPERHERO SCIENCE NIGHT




If your student is absent on a day that they have club, please remember to email the club teacher so that their absence for club that day is excused.


