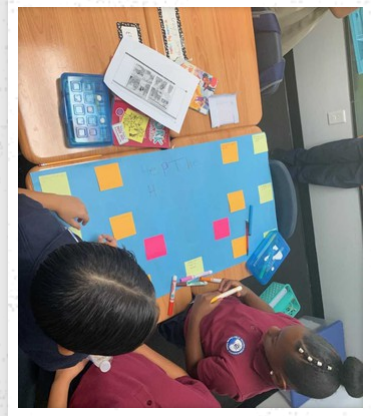
## FOURTH GRADE

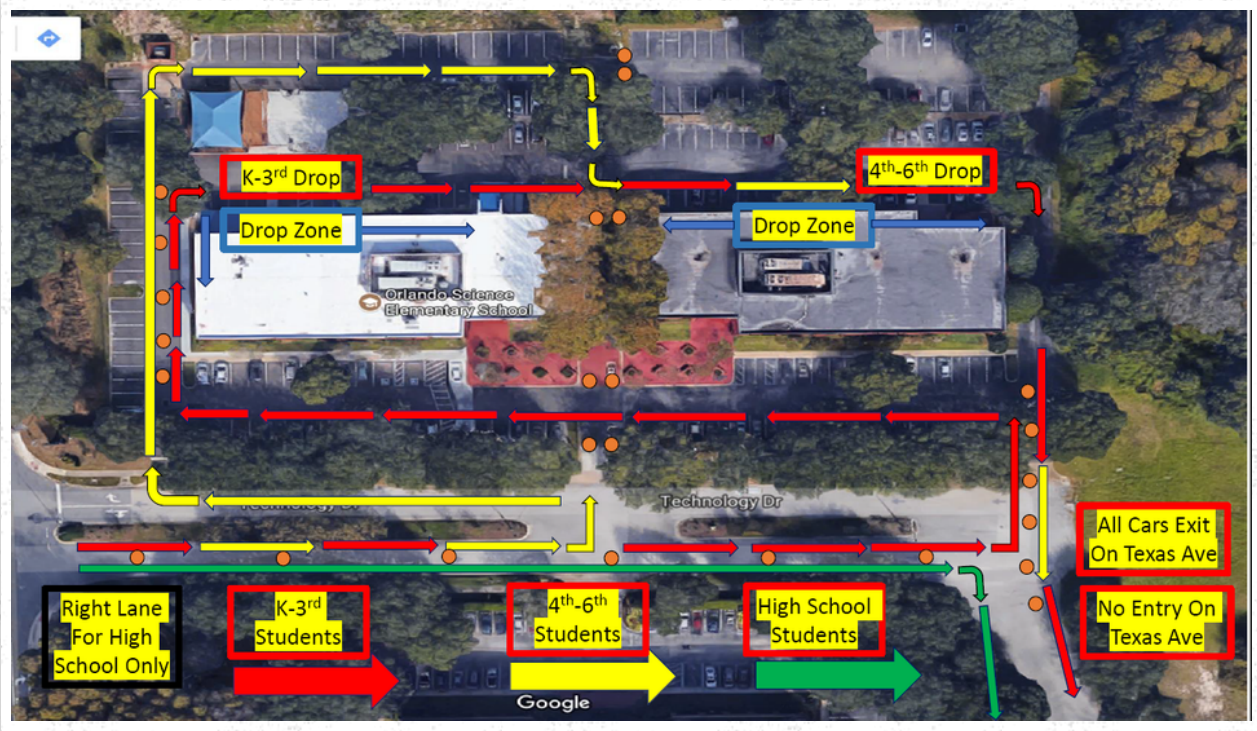
