



Mr. Press's classes spent some time comparing the city-states of Athens and Sparta and made recruitment posters. There were several excellent submissions. Here are just a few.




in Ms. Finsterle's class, we have been reading "The Boy Who Harnessed the Wind." The students were tasked with completing their first of three Tic Tac Toe assignments and some chose to build a model. Some built windmills; we also had a radio and a racecar. There are still two more Tic Tac Toe assignments so more models will be coming soon





In Mrs. Gajus' Pre-Algebra classes, we are learning about angles and lines. This includes different types of angles as well as angle rules within triangles. We are currently working on an angles and lines project in class and will soon be moving on to Pythagorean Theorem. 6th/7th grade classes are learning about solving equations and inequalities, and how to graph inequalities on a number line. We will soon be moving forward into our geometry unit, learning about area and volume. Please make sure your students are keeping up with their weekly Study Island assignments and any other assignments they may be given so that it can be completed and turned in on time.

#### Calling All Scientist!!!!!

The Curtis Rising Stars Science Challenge introduces young students to science competitions and helps them develop teamwork skills. The competition is open to students in Grades K–5, K-2 will be on **February 1st** and 3-5 on **February 15th**. The competition starts at 9 and ends around 2:30-3.

Students are first prepared through pre-activities and prompts with their class at school. The experience culminates in the day-long competition at the Orlando Science Center, when students put their STEM skills into practice.

Parents are to stay with their student at the Orlando Science Center during the competition. At the end of the competition, your family will have access to the Science Center for the rest of the day!



#### **HEALTH AND WELLNESS**

For the health and safety of all our students, please keep your child home when any of the following signs/symptoms are noted, and seek medical attention as needed. The following signs and symptoms may indicate the beginning of a communicable disease:

- \*sore throat \* red eye(s) itchy, crusty, yellow discharge
- \*headache \* nausea
- \*diarrhea (two or more times) \* vomiting (two or more times)
- \*fever (100.5 degrees F or more) \* coughing/wheezing
- \*balding/flaky area with/without patches \* chills
- \*red, swollen areas

Parents of child in school with any of the above symptoms will be notified. In order to prevent illness from being spread to other children in the school, students can **only return to school** when symptoms are resolved and has been fever free for 24 hours *without* the use of fever medication as <u>per OCPS policy</u>.


