In reading Mrs. Beckman's class read the Frog and Toad story "The Kite", and learned all about adjectives. In math we had fun with our graphing extended learning activities!

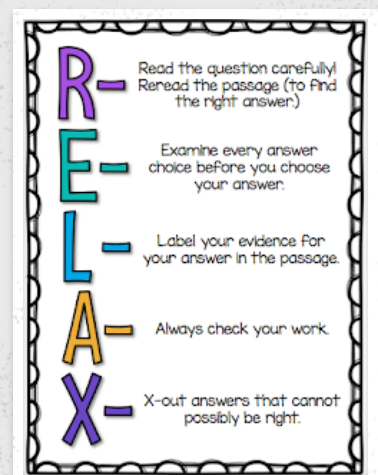
SECOND GRADE

Third grade is working diligently on FSA rotations.

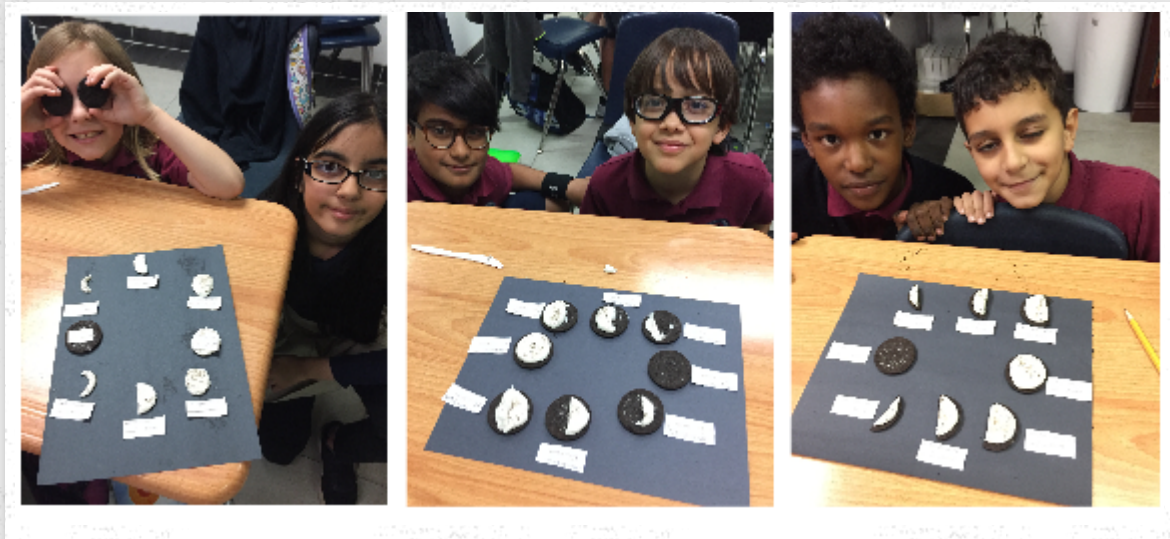
Mrs. Sokoloff's class is working on measurement in math. We are continuing to practice our reading strategies for FSA. RELAX

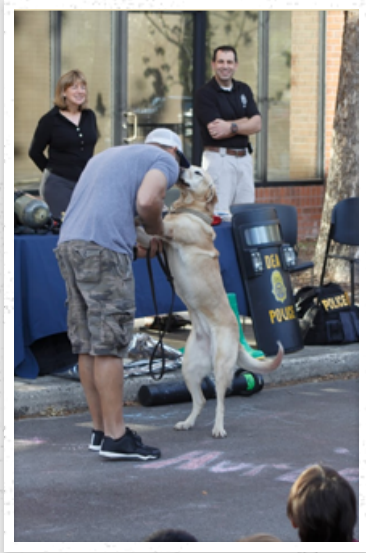

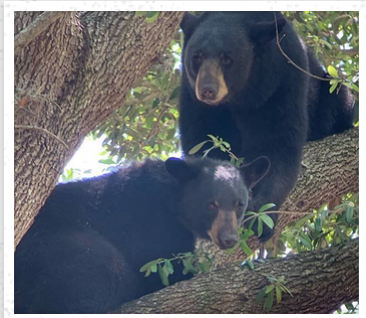
DEA SPECIAL AGENT MARCUS ANDERSON
