through the opening at the base of the skull.


Syringomyelia (SM): sear-IN-go-my-EEL-ya





KINDERGARTEN

This week we read the "Lion and the Mouse" from Aseop's we learned that no matter how big and mighty you might be you still need help from everyone, no matter their size! We also continued working on her short /a/ sounds and identifying where we hear them in the word. We also worked on the /sh/ sound at the beginning and ending of words.

In math we had fun playing place value games, breaking apart numbers in tens and ones and skip counting by 1's and 10's.

We finished our week learning about the different animals from our story in Africa and how they all live amongst each other and get along!

FIRST GRADE

This week our first graders have been exploring fictional texts and thinking about the characters and their feelings. We also have been reviewing place value and our understanding of numbers. We had fun following learning the scientific method and thinking like scientists. Thank you parents for coming out to Curriculum Night!

SECOND GRADE

In Mrs. Waugh's class this week, we worked on writing personal narratives, studied different types of maps, rounded, added, and subtracted three digit numbers, and have been reading Destiny's Gift. In Science, we are continuing to study the nature of science. We practiced our skills with a pointy pencil experiment.

THIRD GRADE

Mrs. Sokoloff's class enjoyed reading Destiny's Gift and relating community and giving.

Ms. Hurley's Class had an awesome time meeting up with our STEM buddies in Ms. Molnar's class! We are super excited about all of the activities we will do with them this year. We are continuing with our read aloud of Charlotte's Web and students are excited to watch the movie and compare the book to the movie. We are completing our first unit in math this week and will be moving on to Multiplication which is unit 2.





FOURTH GRADE

The last two weeks Mrs. Roberts classroom has been a whirlwind of learning! In Science we are learning about how scientists observe, explore, and conduct solid research. We have conducted our personal observations and explored various topics including rivers, the details of our hands and butterfly patterns. Please see the pictures below! In writing we are starting out with informative essays and learning the difference between informative and opinion FSA

writing prompts. They are also learning to find the controlling idea! For ELA/Social Studies we are reading a novel about the capturing of the Castillo de San Marcos in the founding city of St. Austine, Florida. We are learning about the characters, setting, events and plot as we read.









FIFTH GRADE

Ms. Calabrese's class has been working hard to learn about the scientific method and how scientists use the scientific method. This week they did an activity involving pennies and will be working on an activity creating paper airplanes. In math, students have been reviewing place value, powers of 10, and properties of multiplication. Next week, they will be reviewing multiplying and continue to learn about the scientific method.

A reminder to everyone in 5th grade, our Tuck Everlasting field trip will be on September 6. Please make sure your child brings a disposable lunch with them.



SIXTH GRADE

Mrs. Gajus' math classes have been hard at work learning the first set of standards for the year. Pre-Algebra students learned the difference between rational and irrational numbers, and played games in class to help them practice differentiating between the two. Next week they will learn about approximating and comparing rational numbers. My 6/7 classes learned about ratios, unit rates, and percentages. We are looking at both the 6th and 7th grade standards to ensure they have the foundations needed for success in learning 7th grade math throughout the year. Those classes also participated in board games relating to each skill to give them time to practice. Next week they will learn what proportional relationships are and how to identify them. Thank you to all families who attended Curriculum Night on Thursday! My presentation will be posted on OSES Connect soon for you to refer to anytime during the remainder of the year. 

Dear Parents.

I'm excited to tell you about a very special program I'm coordinating at our school in conjunction with Crayola. It's called Crayola ColorCycle – an amazing program devised to repurpose used markers rather than sending them to landfills!

The ColorCycle program has repurposed more than 70 tons of expended markers in the United States and Canada since 2013, and uses the most advanced plastic conversion technologies available today to make wax compounds for asphalt and roofing shingles as well as to generate electricity that can be used to heat homes, cook food, and power vehicles.

All year round Orlando Science students and teachers will be collecting used markers that are ready to be discarded. Please help support our efforts by sending your kids in with any used markers you may have around the house-even non-Crayola brands! Highlighters and dry erase markers can also be included. Drop-off boxes will be located around the school for your child to deposit the markers.




