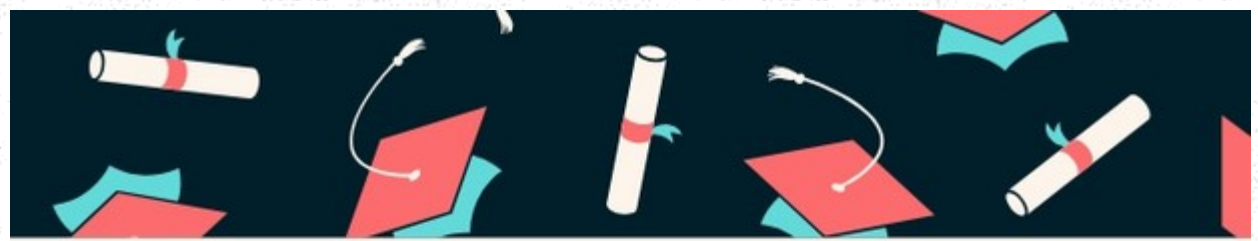

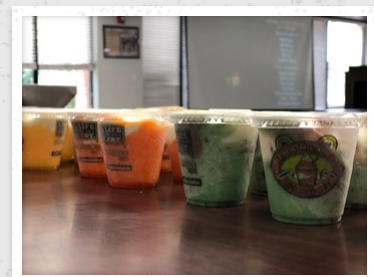
GIRLS ON THE RUN
