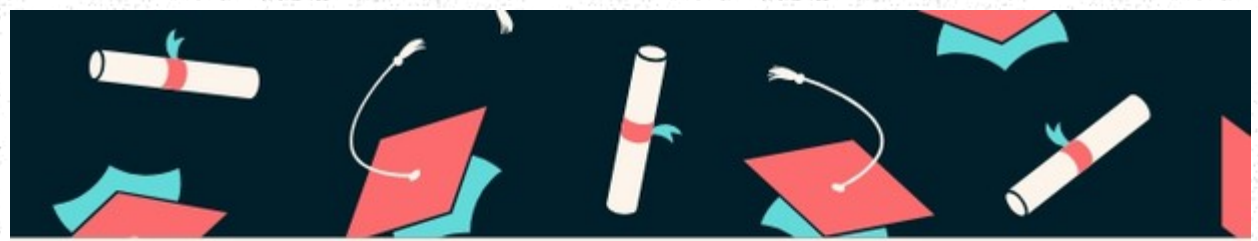

Ms. Molnar's class had so much fun with field day this week! Thank you to all of the parents who helped out and the specials teachers for putting it all together!

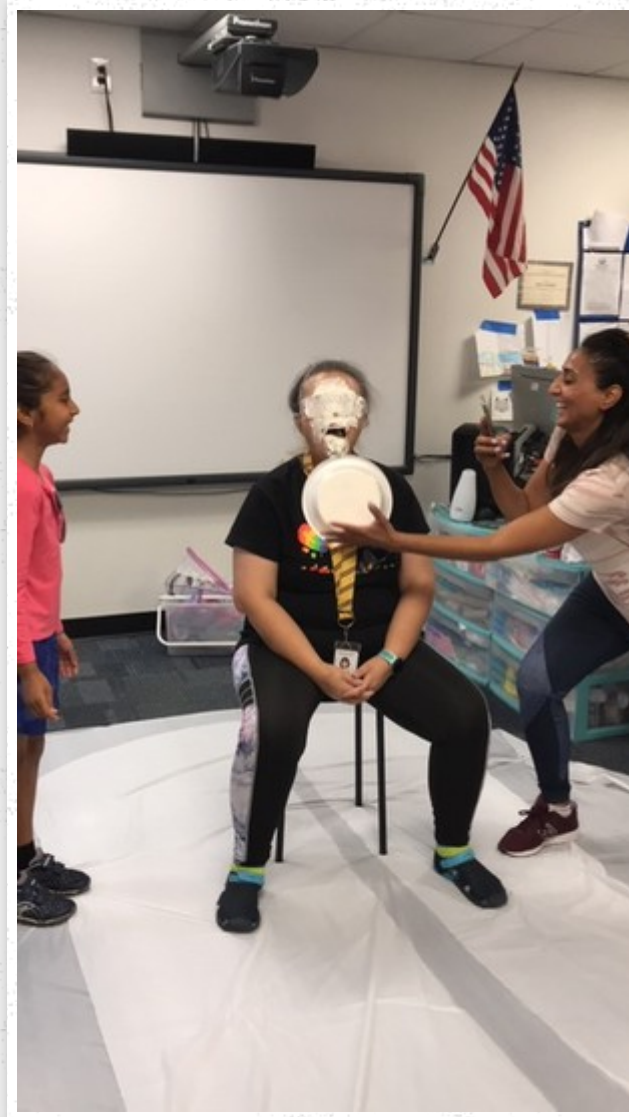
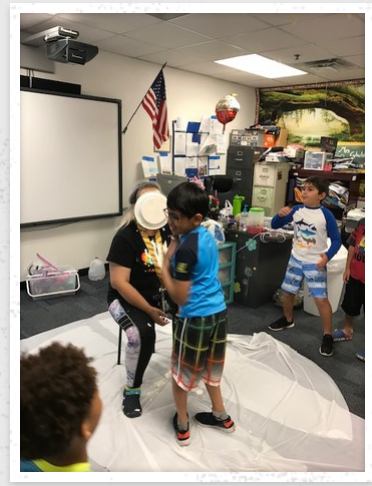
Mrs. Beckman's class had a great week of reviewing capital letters and punctuation in reading and adding tens and ones in math. Have a great weekend everyone!

In Second grade we have had a very fun but very busy week! Field day was so much fun! We would like to thank the wonderful specials teachers and volunteers for making sure it ran as

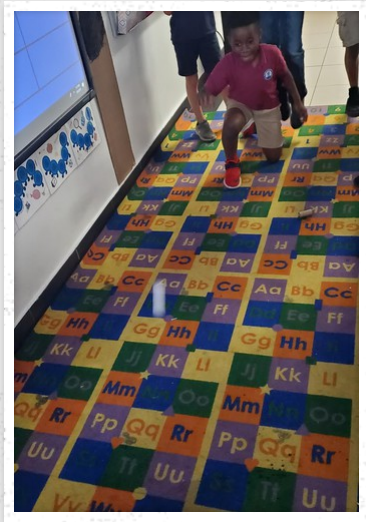
smooth as possible.

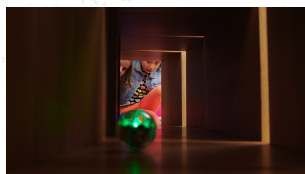
