

Dr. Yalcin Akin is the founder and executive director of Orlando, Seminole and Osceola Science Charter Schools, a group of tuition-free, public charter schools that focus on science, technology, engineering and math education.

Dr. Akin earned his Master of Science and Ph.D. from the University of Florida in materials science and engineering. Prior to founding Orlando Science Schools, Dr. Akin worked with the National Science Foundation (NSF) and Department of Energy supporting numerous projects at the National High Magnetic Field Laboratory in Tallahassee.

The Orlando Science Charter Schools serve a

diverse, K-12 population of more than 2,500 students at four campuses in Orange, Seminole and Osceola counties. Since opening in 2008, Orlando Science School has been consistently ranked as one of the best schools in the state of Florida, and is also ranked one of the Top 100 Most Challenging High Schools in the U.S. by The Washington Post. It currently stands in the top 15 percent of all schools in the state of Florida.

Dr. Akin is an active member of the Florida Consortium of Public Charter Schools. He is a frequent speaker on topics of high-quality charter school education and regularly participates in the annual Florida Charter School Conferences.
