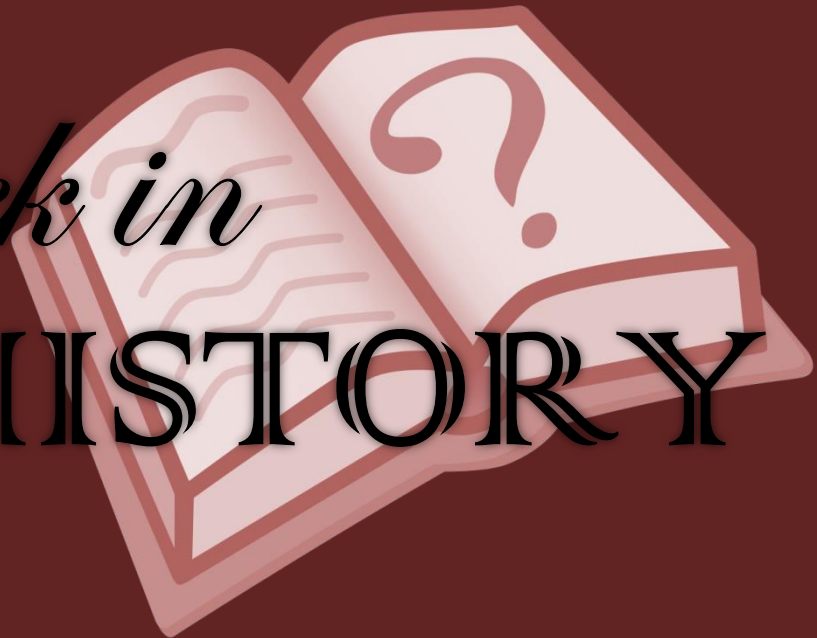

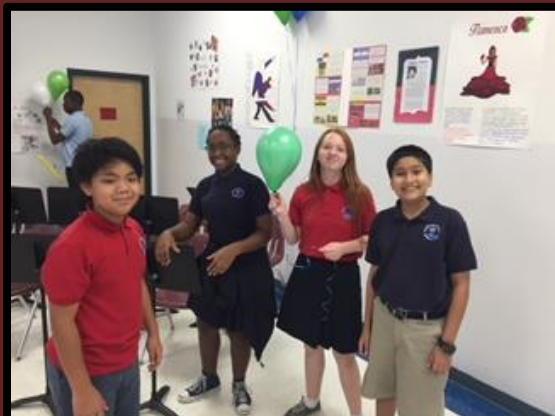
The club has focused on pencil drawings of the human eye and one-perspective rooms. At the moment, the club is focusing on slogans for Red Ribbon Week.

Orlando Science has added a second administration of the PSAT 8/9, for 8th and 9th grade students who were not able to register for the PSAT 8/9 administered on October 28, 2015. These students have another option to take the PSAT 8/9, on **Wednesday, December 9, 2015**. The **test fee is \$10.00**. **The deadline to register for the PSAT 8/9 is November 5, 2015**. Registration form is attached to this letter.

The PSAT 8/9 is the first test in the SAT Suite of Assessments. Tightly aligned with the SAT, PSAT/NMSQT, and PSAT 10, it establishes a baseline for college and career readiness as students enter high school. We encourage all eligible students to sit for the assessment and will provide guidance.

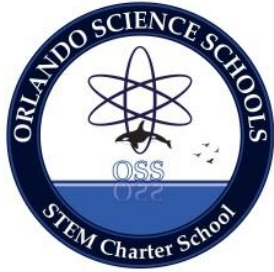

Orlando Science has received FSA ELA Reading and Math percentile score report. The score report will be distributed to students on Tuesday, October 27th.

The Florida Department of Education has released limited student score information for the Florida Standards Assessment. The score report does not indicate whether or not a student has 'passed' the assessment. The student report includes a percentile that describes how a student performed relative to other students taking the assessment statewide. For example, a student scoring in the 65th percentile scored as well or better than 65 percent of students taking that assessment.

These reports will not include new achievement levels (1 through 5) as in the past. New achievement level standards will be set by the State Board of Education early next year, and updated information through a new student score report will be provided to parents at that time.

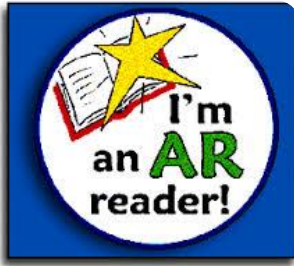

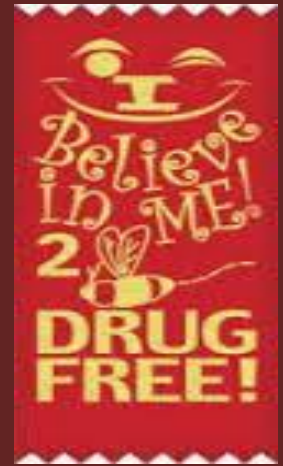
