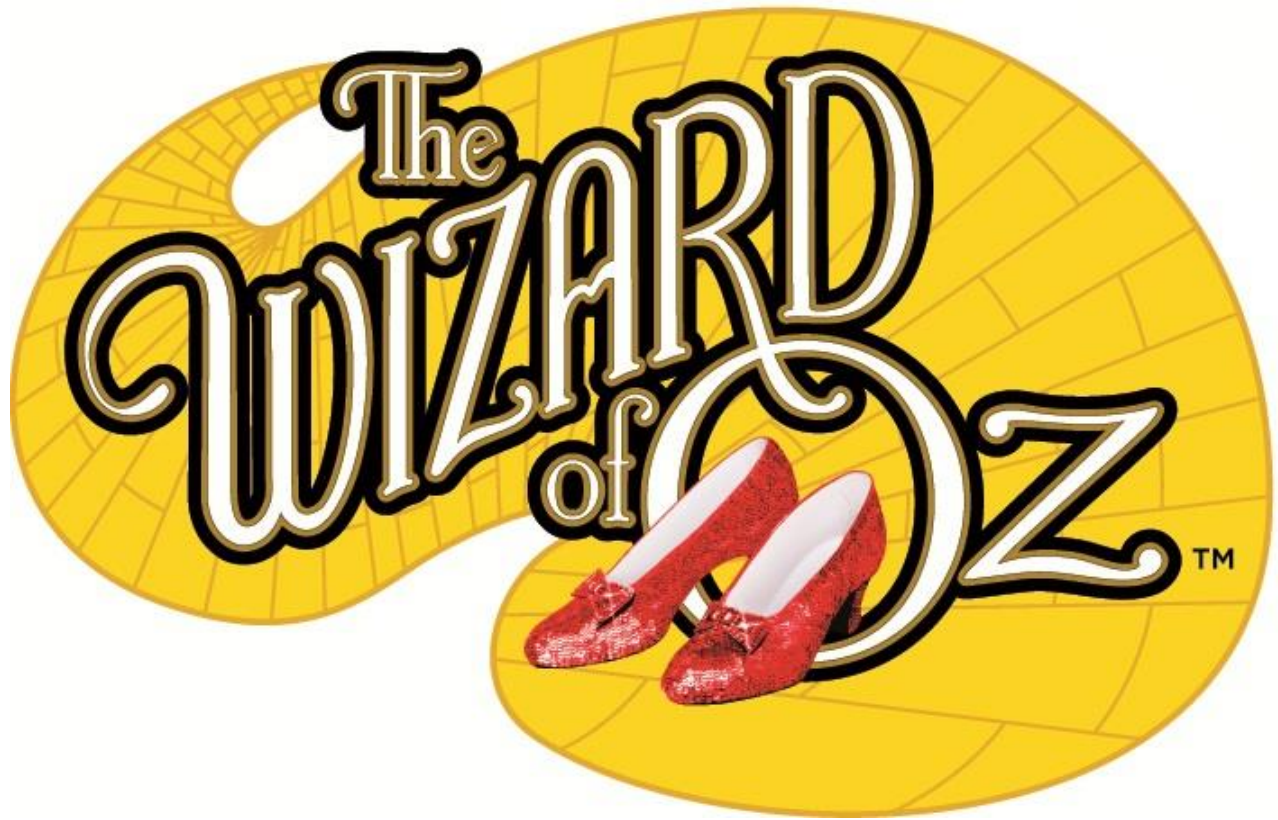


Dress Like Your Teacher Day

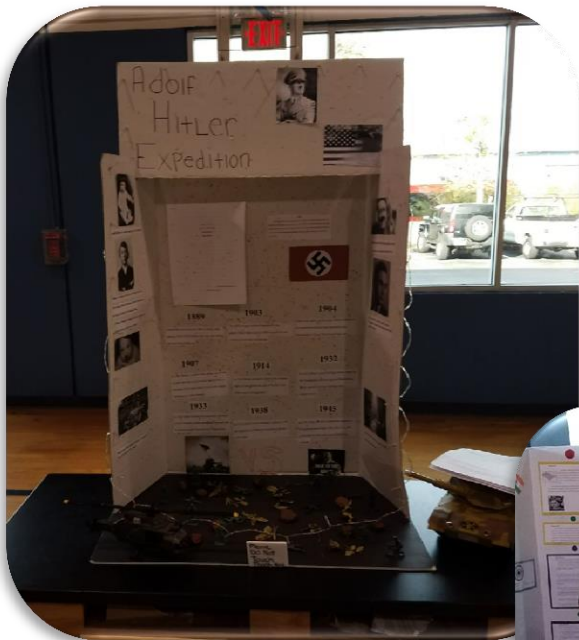
Club of the Week

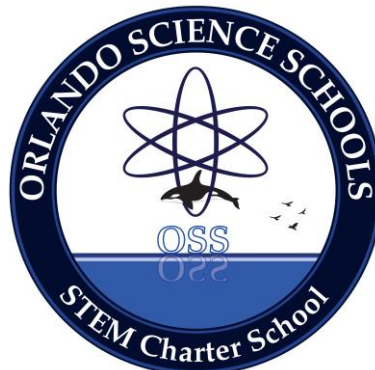

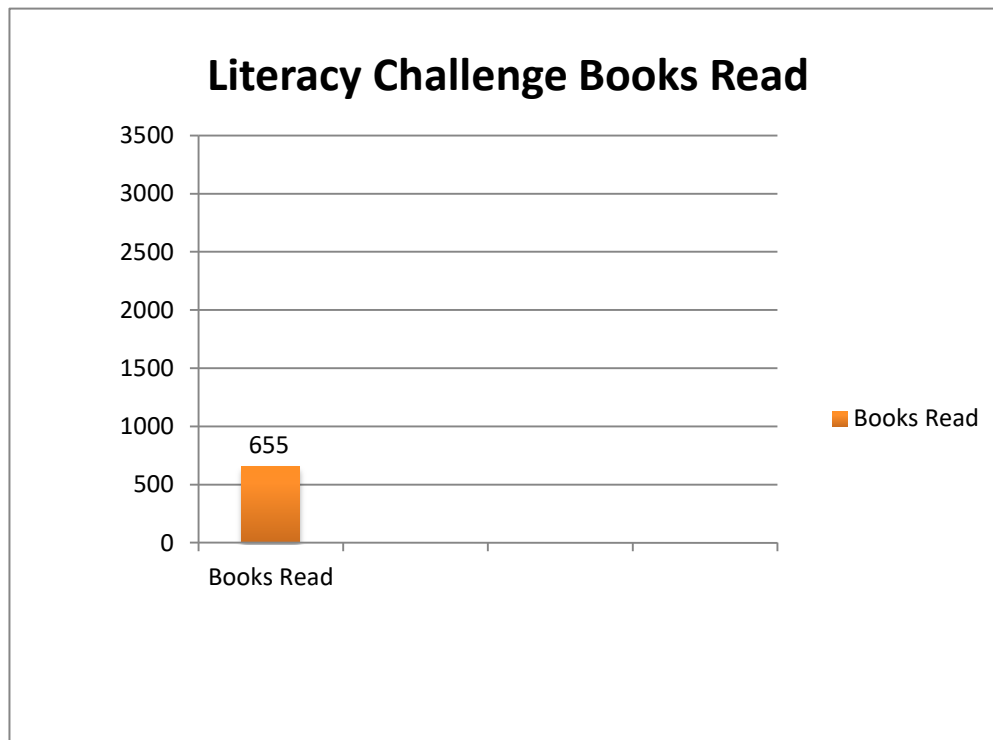
