- New Address\*: If you have moved, you must fill out the first two pages of the 2017-2018 Enrollment document. An original copy of your lease must be brought to the school registrar before school starts. You will also need a correct proof of Orange County Domicile. You will find these pages on www.orlandoscience.org →Select the "Enrollment Form" button located on the navy blue bar on the left hand side of the webpage→select the "Enrollment Forms" link. Please note you will only need pages one and two.
- 2017-2018 Emergency Contact Form\*: Please be advised that ALL STUDENTS will be required to turn in a "2017-2017 Emergency Contact Form". These forms are not optional; if the form is not supplied to OSS by open house your student will not be given their 2017-2018 Class Schedule. # **Advanced Band**

#### Club Sponsor: Mr. Jenkins

OSS MH Advanced Band club meets 3 days a week and offers opportunity for players seeking more advanced musical learning. It is reserved for players who have at least 1 year of consistent experience playing on their instrument of choice. Advanced performance materials and more difficult musical literature are used to continue to push the talents of these young players. These students are then incorporated into the Middle School and High School Beginner Band. These students are then able to act as leaders and provide examples of proper playing for the more inexperienced players.

The Advanced Band Club, along with the Beginning Band, have put on performances throughout the year for the enjoyment of parents and guests. The Holiday Concert at the end of the first semester provided a good measuring point of the hard work they have put in while performing some beloved holiday songs. Select players from this group also participated in our performance at Sunday in the Park in College Park, which provided some valuable community outreach. They also performed for the AdvancEd Accreditation Dinner in April, which allowed us to highlight our place and importance to our school's curriculum, even within a STEM-specialized school. Our performance year culminated in the final performance, the annual Spring Concert. The students exhibited music that was far more difficult than any that was attempted in previous years while providing a very entertaining show filled with new music, as well as some familiar favorites.





An Orlando chapter called Ekal Vidyalaya is an organization that is not about just providing funds so that impoverished children in India can get an education, it goes beyond that. It takes roughly 5 years to get a "village" ready for an Ekal teacher to come and start classes. For the most part they are lucky if they have a 1 room building to have as a school, most of the time it's just under a tree. The villages are so remote; roads etc. are very difficult to provide access for the teacher. But Ekal goes beyond just providing a teacher. They help the farmers and the community learns new life skills in many different ways.

For the Rao family, they have been extremely moved by the good humanitarian efforts of Ekal, that when they went to India last summer, they felt it was very important for their children to visit an Ekal village school for perspective. They had an amazing/ life altering experience.

Usually Ekal will have a musical group that travels to the US for about 6 months visiting the major cities and raising money. That is the easy part on the US side. During the event in Orlando we usually raise around \$100,000 which is sponsoring about 300 schools. Each school is sponsored by a contributing a \$1 a day, for an entire village, that's \$365.00 for the whole year.

This year the Rao Family exceed that goal and started a Youth program here in Orlando. Some children other than their own already attend OSS; these kids are amazing about getting out in the community and making Ekal Vidyalaya known. The Rao children had the privilege of speaking in front of an event audience of over 800 people. They were awesome! Part of what the youth group does is making their presence known throughout the year in different formats. Various cultural activities and then we now added an essay contest (see flyer following the photos on the next page) and this new workshop called Appathon.

The pilot programs for the Appathon in Boston charged \$60 per person as a donation to Ekal and that included lunch. We have control and discretion on how we arrange this here. The workshop basically is run by a group of high schoolers and a few computer minded adults. It really is a fun filled day. In the morning the kids get to brainstorm on what kind of app they feel is needed and the community needs, and the rest of the day they are not only shown how to build an App, but actually build the app to a working status.

#### Orlando Science Schools Students Honored for Exceptional Academic Success

DURHAM, NC — Twenty five 7th grade students from Orlando Science Schools were among the students being honored by the Duke University Talent Identification Program (Duke TIP) for their exceptional scores on the ACT or SAT. The students were recognized at a ceremony at University of South Florida on Monday, May 8th 2017.

Duke TIP's 7th Grade Talent Search identifies students across the United States who have scored at or above the 95th percentile on a grade-level standardized test. As part of the program, these academically talented students take above-level college-entrance exams to learn more about their abilities. Duke TIP then hosts annual recognition ceremonies to honor the seventh graders who scored the highest on these ACT or SAT exams. "We are extremely proud to recognize our remarkably talented students who have demonstrated key aspects of their academic potential by achieving scores on the ACT or SAT commensurate with half of all college-bound high school seniors," says Shawna Young, Executive Director of Duke TIP. "As an alumnus of our 7th Grade Talent Search, I still remember how it felt to be recognized by Duke and TIP in seventh grade, as well as my excitement and anxiety at taking the SAT at such a young age. As an organization, we cherish the opportunity to celebrate each of our ceremonies honorees for such an outstanding accomplishment."

Working with host academic institutions, Duke TIP sponsors thirty-six ceremonies in sixteen states throughout April, May, and June. Speakers include university administrators and professors from the host institutions, state and government officials, and accomplished former Duke TIP students.
