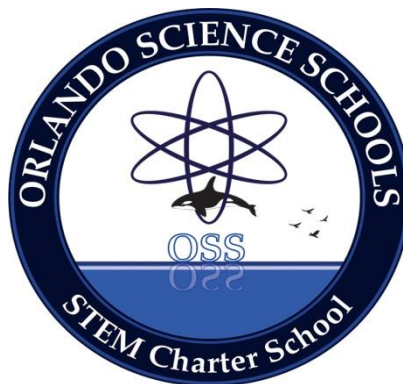

Attention all 10th and 11th graders!!!

Mark your calendar for Wednesday, October 19th. On that day, you will be taking Pre-SAT exam. The PSAT is a vital step toward reaching your college goals. It measures the reading, writing and language, and math skills you need for college and a career. After the test, you'll receive feedback on how ready you are for college along with tools to help you improve. Your scores from the PSAT/NMSQT will also be used to determine your eligibility and qualification for the National Merit Scholarship Program. The test will support all students with a clear focus on the skills and knowledge that matter most for college and career success. Educators will be able to:

- Measure and follow student performance.
- Pinpoint areas for development.
- Prepare students for the redesigned SAT.

The PSAT/NMSQT will focus on the knowledge and skills that current research shows are most essential for college and career readiness and success. The tests will reflect the work students are doing in classrooms across the country and around the globe.

The new PSAT/NMSQT will give students access to free personalized SAT study. With students' explicit permission, Khan Academy will use their PSAT/NMSQT results to create a study plan especially for them.
