Orlando Science Schools (OSS) is a tuition-free public charter school in Orange County with an emphasis on science, technology, engineering and math (STEM) education. With increasing annual enrollment since its opening in 2008, OSS offers K – 12 students a well-rounded curriculum aligned with Florida Sunshine State Standards and taught in an intimate learning environment (16:1 student-teacher ratio). Located in metro Orlando near the intersection of Princeton St. and John Young Parkway, OSS is the educational "home base" for more than 1,000 Central Florida students, representing diverse cultural and economic backgrounds.

Beyond academic excellence in the classroom, OSS offers many social and recreational opportunities that create a close-knit student body. Students participate and compete on local and national levels in a variety of extra-curricular activities, ranging from Science Olympiad and robotics teams to Model UN and band.
