
Jan 23, 1957: Toy company Wham-O produces first Frisbees

On this day in 1957, machines at the Wham-O toy company roll out the first batch of their aerodynamic plastic discs--now known to millions of fans all over the world as Frisbees. The story of the Frisbee began in Bridgeport, <u>Connecticut</u>, where William Frisbie opened the Frisbie Pie Company in 1871. Students from nearby universities would throw the empty pie tins to each other, yelling "Frisbie!" as they let go. In 1948, Walter Frederick Morrison and his partner Warren Franscioni invented a plastic version of the disc called the "Flying Saucer" that could fly further and more accurately than the tin pie plates. After splitting with Franscioni, Morrison made an improved model in 1955 and sold it to the new toy company Wham O as the "Pluto Platter"--an attempt to cash in on the public craze over space and Unidentified Flying Objects (UFOS).

Jan 25, 1905: World's largest diamond found

On January 25, 1905, at the Premier Mine in Pretoria, South Africa, a 3,106-carat diamond is discovered during a routine inspection by the mine's superintendent. Weighing 1.33 pounds, and christened the "Cullinan," it was the largest diamond ever found.

Our Science Olympiad Team Won 1st Place at Regional's

Regional competition for Science Olympiad was held at Lake Nona Middle School on Saturday, January 18th. We would like to congratulate the Orlando Science Schools Science Olympiad Team and their head coach, Mr. Demir, for winning first place overall among 20 other teams. There were 23 events and we received 10 first place medals, 4 second place medals and 4 third place medals. This is an amazing accomplishment – placing in the top 3 for 18 of the 23 events. Our teams work very hard to prepare for this competition. There were 32 middle school students who participated. Some of the events include Anatomy, Boomilever, Heredity, Meteorology, Road Scholar, Robo Cross, Simple Machines, Solar System and Water Quality. Now, the team will begin to prepare for the State Competition on March 15th which will be held at UCF. We would like to thank the teachers and parent volunteers who are part of this success as well. Orlando Science Mustangs (U14 Boys) Soccer team is planning to participate in the Local Spring Season League in Association of Christian Youth Sports, Orlando Florida.

If we succeed in becoming affiliated with ACYS, then we will be able to practice twice a week and will be provided a game schedule.

Currently, our team holds practice every week in Emery Hamilton Soccer Field.

Our priority as a team is to become eligible to participate in the Greater Central Florida Youth Soccer League which will enable our students the opportunity to apply for scholarships.
