This Week in History



This week in history, the first teddy bear went on sale.

On February 15, 1903, toy store owner Morris Michtom put two stuffed bears in the window of his shop in New York. He called his creation the Teddy Bear after President Theodore "Teddy" Roosevelt.

Roosevelt was famous for being a burly outdoorsman and avid hunter. However, on a hunting trip in 1902, he took pity on a bear tied to a tree. Instead of shooting the bear, he set it free. Political cartoonists portrayed the bear as a cub to promote President Teddy's soft side.

Michtom loved the story. He wrote to Roosevelt for permission to use the name, and the president gave his permission. The bears became an instant hit and were soon popular children's toys.






CAN TABS
