As the end of the school year approaches, OSS has a few important details that need to be addressed.

- 1. \*\*Upcoming 7<sup>th</sup> graders, you must get your 7<sup>th</sup> grade immunizations before next school year
- 2. \*\*All students must get a physical before next school year
- 3. **\*\***If you have moved, you must fill out the first two pages of the enrollment forms, located on our website; plus, the correct proof of Orange County Domicile.

#### <u>\*\* bring in the original of the above documents to the school registrar.</u> If you do not supply OSS with these documents, your student will not be given a schedule <u>or placed in any classes.</u>

4. Pick up any medications/inhalers, etc. before school ends, otherwise they will be properly disposed.

Dear Parent/ Guardian,

The Algebra 1 class will update its Florida Common Core State Standards starting in the 2014-2015 school year. Students who currently take the Algebra-1 Course will be required to take the Algebra-1 End of Course Test (EOCT). Students must pass the Algebra-1 EOCT to earn high school credit for this course.

The high school requirement for Florida state colleges is to take at least 4 Math classes during high school. Students who pass the Algebra class will take upper level math classes to complete their requirement. This is, of course, a big plus for securing a better college admission.

The Math standards are becoming more of a challenge. Orlando Science Schools need to make sure that students who will be taking Algebra are actually ready to take Algebra, and they will be expected to pass the EOC test. We need to make sure that our students are receiving the best education for their levels.

We will be working with a test company to administer an Algebra Readiness Test on Tuesday, June 3rd 2014. The students who are expecting to take Algebra 1 in the 2014-2015 school year, should they pass the Algebra readiness test, must receive a teacher recommendation and a high FCAT Math and Reading scores. You may find the placement weigh chart below.

Test/Category	Percent
Algebra Readiness Test - Session-1	25%
Algebra Readiness Test- Session-2	20%
FCAT MATH DSS Score	45%
Teacher Recommendation	10%

The Algebra readiness test results should be available the second week of June. The results will be announced as student "ready or not ready" for Algebra.
