This Week in History

Dec 11 1946- UNICEF is founded

In the aftermath of World War II, the General Assembly of the United Nations votes to establish the United Nations International Children's Emergency Fund (UNICEF), an organization to help provide relief and support to children living in countries devastated by the war.

After the food and medical crisis of the late 1940s passed, UNICEF continued its role as a relief organization for the children of troubled nations and during the 1970s grew into a vocal advocate of children's rights. During the 1980s, UNICEF assisted the U.N. Commission on Human Rights in the drafting of the Convention on the Rights of the Child. After its introduction to the U.N. General Assembly in 1989, the Convention on the Rights of the Child became the most widely ratified human rights treaty in history, and UNICEF played a key role in ensuring its enforcement.

Questions and Answers for Semester Finals

- Q-1) How would Semester Finals affect my student's grade?
 - It affects 7% of the student's overall Semester Grade.
- Q-2) How long will the Semester Final take
 - One Class Period- the same length as Chapter Tests
- Q-3) How many questions will be asked in the Finals?
 - Depends on the Department.
- 30 Questions in Math, Web Design, and Visual Basic. 40 Questions in Other Departments
- Q-4) How would the students take the Semester finals, if they have Accommodations?
 - Yes, they will receive the accommodations as in written in their IAP or IEP.
- Q-5) What if my student(s) is absent on the Semester Final days?
 - > The student may make up when s/he comes to school.
- Q-6) What type of questions will be on the test?
 - The test will be a multiple choice test and it will cover all the topics between the first lesson and 4 days before the Finals.
- Q-7) Will there be other classes on the Finals day?
 - > Yes, the students would take only the designated subjects final in one class period. There will not be a different schedule on test days.
- Q-7) Are the Semester Finals created on OSS Connect?
 - > Yes, they are available under the Final weeks.
- Q-8) Who is the best contact person if I have any questions?

In April, along with many other Orange County schools, we will join the Ronald McDonald House in the "2013-14 School Pop Tab Recycling Contest".


The tabs collected will help families with sick children.


