# **1881**

# **American Red Cross founded**

In Washington, D.C., humanitarians Clara Barton and Adolphus Solomons found the American National Red Cross, an organization established to provide humanitarian aid to victims of wars and natural disasters in congruence with the International Red Cross.

Barton, born in Massachusetts in 1821, worked with the sick and wounded during the American Civil War and became known as the "Angel of the Battlefield" for her tireless dedication. In 1865, President Abraham Lincoln commissioned her to search for lost prisoners of war, and with the extensive records she had compiled during the war she succeeded in identifying thousands of the Union dead at the Andersonville prisoner-ofwar camp.

She was in Europe in 1870 when the Franco-Prussian War broke out, and she went behind the German lines to work for the International Red Cross. In 1873, she returned to the United States, and four years later she organized an American branch of the International Red Cross. The American Red Cross received its first U.S. federal charter in 1900. Barton headed the organization into her 80s and died in 1912.



Thirteen 7th Graders Gain State Recognition in Duke TIP

Thirteen Orlando Science School students were honored last Tuesday afternoon at a state recognition ceremony by The Duke University Talent Identification Program at University of North Florida in Jacksonville. Duke TIP honors academically-talented seventh graders for their exceptional scores on the ACT or SAT. The students recognized for their outstanding academic achievements are Fiza Ali, Saardhak Bhrugubanda, Miscia Fortna, Khushil Ganti, Sanjana Konda, Dylan Maliza, Alvin Naiju, Abhi Patel, Esha Ranade, Mira Saldanha, Harshitha Uppada, Jared Wheelhouse and Hanna Yamaguchi.

In addition to state recognition, Esha Ranade, Sanjana Konda, Harshitha Uppada and Saardhak Bhrugubanda earned the highest honor of grand recognition and received an invitation to the grand ceremony held in Cameron Indoor Stadium on the Duke University campus.

Duke TIP's 7th Grade Talent Search identifies students across the United States who have scored at or above the 95th percentile on a grade-level achievement test.

As part of the program, these academically talented students take above-level college-entrance exams to learn more about their abilities. Duke TIP then hosts annual recognition ceremonies to honor the seventh graders who scored the highest on these ACT or SAT exams.

"As seventh graders, these students have achieved scores on the ACT or SAT rivaling those of half of all college-bound seniors who took the tests. We are extremely proud of our ceremonies honorees, and we appreciate the opportunity to celebrate their achievement and encourage them in their academic potential," says Martha Putallaz, PhD, executive director of Duke TIP and professor of psychology and neuroscience at Duke University.

Orlando Science Schools will be offering classes called academic/athletic electives for grades 6-10 in 2015-2016 academic year. Academic electives are designed to encourage and help our Gifted and Advanced students to participate in academic competitions. We will have classes towards Math, Science, Technology, Engineering, Social Studies and World Language contests. We strongly encourage our students to challenge themselves beyond the expected grade level curriculum, and we believe these classes will provide a support for this goal. <u>Students will be assigned to ONLY one of these classes in elective period. Enrolling in these classes neither requires, nor guarantees competing in the actual tournaments if the elective has a related competition.</u> Students, who do not make their selection, will be assigned from one of the academic electives. Please note that these electives are different than Orlando Science Biomedical Sciences, Orlando Science Engineering Program and Orlando Science Legal and Business Studies Program, and Orlando Science AP Academy. You may still take the electives at the same time even if you are accepted in one of these High School programs.
