### ORLANDO SCIENCE SCHOOLS AND FLORIDA INSTITUTE OF TECHNOLOGY ANNOUNCE PARTNERSHIP

**Orlando, Fla.** – September 16, 2014 – <u>Orlando Science Schools</u> (OSS) was honored to be named the first Panther Ambassador of the Florida Institute of Technology (FIT) at a recent presentation on the OSS campus.

The partnership between the two schools will encourage collaboration efforts, spark interest and help OSS high school students learn about STEM-based career opportunities. Orlando Science Schools, a public charter school in Orange County that serves grades K-12 and focuses on STEM education, represents the first school to be selected to receive the Panther Ambassador honor from Florida Tech, known as "The STEM University."

Aviator, shuttle astronaut and U.S. Navy Capt. Winston E. Scott spoke to the students about his life experiences at the recent presentation. Scott currently serves as the senior vice president for external relations and economic development at Florida Tech. He also holds the rank of professor of aeronautics in the College of Aeronautics and professor of music in the College of Psychology and Liberal Arts.

"We were looking to establish a relationship with STEM-focused high schools and we saw a lot of synergies with Orlando Science Schools," said Leslie Hielema, vice president of Florida Tech's Orlando Center. "We want students to know that STEM-based jobs are exciting. It doesn't mean you have to sit in a lab all day. These careers have amazing potential, and we are pleased that both OSS and Florida Tech play such a key role in preparing young adults for jobs in this growing field."

The Panther Ambassador designation will leverage assets at both schools. Campus tours and presentations will provide OSS high school students with a broad understanding of career paths. In addition, competitions and camps will promote strong teamwork and increase students' knowledge in specific skill sets.

"We are thrilled to be working with FIT to identify ways to connect our students with higher learning potential," said Orlando Science Schools Executive Director Dr. Yalcin Akin.



The annual Interservice/Industry Training, Simulation and Education Conference (I/ITSEC) will be held in Orlando.
