OSS conducted its annual school-level middle school spelling bee on Wed., Jan. 20. Classroom spelling bee winners and runners-up advanced to this school-wide spelling bee as school semifinalists.

This school-wide spelling bee winner is S. Mishra, who will advance to the Orange County district spelling bee, which will take place Thurs., Feb. 25. And Runner up is W. D'Aguiar. Congratulations to both of the students!



# Club of the Week: Robot i CS

Orlando Science Schools has a FIRST Robotics Competition (FRC) team, 4013 Clockwork Mania. Most Clockwork Mania team members also compete in the FIRST Tech Challenge (FTC) as 5070 N.U.T.S. (Nerds United for Technological Superiority), FIRST is a national non-profit organization which inspires youth to further study, experience and pursue careers in Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM) through a robotics competition.

Clockwork Mania is going into its fifth year. Our team earned a regional FRC Rookie All Star Award in our first year, earning us a ticket to the FRC World Championship in 2012. N.U.T.S. won the FTC Inspired Award at the Florida State Championship; this is the highest state award an FTC team can win, earning us an invitation the FTC World Championship in 2013. We won a regional FRC Chairman's Award, the highest award a team can earn at this level of competition, this also earn us an invitation to the FRC World Championship in 2014, furthermore Clockwork Mania won the Imagery Award, in the Archimedes Division. Only the top 5% FRC teams in the world receive awards at the FRC World Championship. This is a feat that has taken other teams many years to achieve. The team won the Chairman's Award at the Peachtree Regional in 2015 advancing again to the World Championship. At the 2015 World Championship one of our students, Sebastian Orellana, won the FRC Dean's List Award, only 10 winners are selected out of 73,000 FRC students from 19 countries worldwide.

Clockwork Mania is composed of OSS students from grades 8<sup>th</sup>-12th; the team has limited spots and holds an orientation and recruitment meeting at beginning of every school year.

## National Geographic Geography Bee at OSS

Orlando Science Schools conducted the Geo Bee competition on January 28, 2016. There were ten finalists from 6<sup>th</sup> – 8<sup>th</sup> Grade. Amitha Karuppiah, a 6<sup>th</sup> grade student, won the school competition and a chance at \$50,000 college scholarship.

The school bee, at which students answered questions on geography, was the first round in the 28th annual National Geographic Bee. Thousands of schools around the United States and in the five U.S. territories are participating in the 2016 Bee. Amitha, will take a qualifying test; up to 100 of the top scorers on that test in each state will then be eligible to compete in their state Bee on April 1, 2016.

The National Geographic Society will provide an all-expenses paid trip to Washington, D.C., for state winners to participate in the Bee national championship rounds May 22-25, 2016. The first place national champion will receive a \$50,000 college scholarship, a lifetime membership in the Society including a subscription to National Geographic magazine, and a National Geographic Expeditions trip to a national park in recognition of the 100th anniversary of the National Park Service. The national finals will air on television on the National Geographic Channel and PBS stations.


Dear Parents, sophomores and Juniors,

PSAT/NMSQT results were distributed to you and we kept a school copy in your file. Some of you may need help in understating the new designed PSAT/NMSQT Scores. Without some context for understanding your reports, you may rush to look at your scores and stop there. I recommend that you review by using the below resources on the next two pages and schedule a meeting with Mr. I to go over your individual scores and ask questions. Please also ask Mr. Isikli (I) how to get free, personalized SAT study suggestions on the Khan Academy® platform. Online score reports will no longer be called My College Quick Start, but you will have access to a new, detailed online reporting portal that will expand to include scores from all the tests in the SAT Suite of Assessments. You can interact with your score report, filtering test questions by difficulty and skill level. You may also view complete answer explanations.

#### What Are Ima's Scores?

Ima's Evidence-Based Reading and Writing score is 380 and Math is 480. In Evidence-Based Reading and Writing, Ima's score is approaching the benchmark (explained on the report), but she is not quite on track for college readiness. In Math, however, Ima is exceeding the benchmark and is on track. Test scores, cross-test scores, and subscores can give Ima a better understanding of areas to work on.

#### What Are Her Score Percentiles?


Since Ima is in the 10th grade, the percentiles compare her scores with those of all 10th-graders in the nation. Ima scored as well as or better in Evidence-Based Reading and Writing than 18 percent of a nationally representative group of sophomores. In Math, she scored as well as or better than 47 percent of a nationally representative group of sophomores. Additional percentiles are available in Ima's online score report.

#### **How Will Ima Do on the SAT®?**

The PSAT/NMSQT® and SAT are scored on a common scale; therefore if Ima had taken the SAT instead of the PSAT/NMSQT on the same test date, she would have received the same score. When Ima takes the SAT, she will likely have had additional learning from school and practice. Her PSAT/NMSQT results can help Ima focus her efforts in high school to be better prepared for the SAT.

#### What Are Her Score Ranges?

No test measures precisely what someone knows, and many factors can affect results. That is why test makers think of each score as a range that extends from a few points below to a few points above the score earned.





#### OSS is the Chapter Champion!




