

JUNIOR YEAR TO DO LIST!

Spring

- Meet with your college coordinator/AP to review senior-year course selection and graduation requirements.
- Discuss ACT Assessment/SAT I scores with your college coordinator. Register to take the ACT Assessment and/or SAT I again if you'd like to try to improve your score.
- Discuss the college essay with your English teacher.
- Stay involved with your extracurricular activities. Colleges look for consistency and depth in activities.
- Consider whom you will ask to write your recommendations. Think about asking teachers who know you well and who will write positive letters about you. Letters from a coach, activity leader, or an adult who knows you well outside of school (e.g., volunteer work contact) are also valuable.
- Inquire about personal interviews at your favorite colleges. Call or write for early summer appointments. Make necessary travel arrangements.
- Apply for a summer job or internship. Be prepared to pay for college application, financial aid, and testing fees in fall.
- Request applications from schools you're interested in or apply online.

Summer

- Visit the campuses of your top 2 or 3 college choices.
- After each college interview, send a thank-you letter to the interviewer.
- Talk to people you know who have attended the colleges in which you are interested.
- Continue to read books, magazines, and newspapers.
- Practice filling out college applications, and then complete the final application forms or apply online through the Web sites of the colleges in which you're interested.
- Volunteer in your community.
- Compose rough drafts of your college essays. Have a teacher read and discuss them with you. Proofread them, and prepare final drafts. Proofread your final essays at least three times.
- Develop a financial aid application plan, including a list of the aid sources, requirements for each application, and a timetable for meeting the filing deadlines.

ORLANDO SCIENCE SCHOOLS STUDENTS PARTICIPATE IN NATIONAL MATHEMATICS COMPETITION

30 students at Orlando Science Schools participated in the 67th annual American Mathematics Contest 12, and/or the 17th annual American Mathematics Contest 10. The contests were held on Wednesday, February 17, 2016). The students competed for local, regional and national student and school awards. The contest, which covers high school mathematics, is given in participating schools. Its purpose is to spur interest in mathematics and develop talent through the excitement of friendly competition at problem solving in a timed format. In 2015, over 210,000 students from 4,100 schools participated in the AMC 10 & AMC 12 contest.

Top scorers at OSS were Esha R. in AMC 10 and Zhi (Jimmy) W. in AMC 12. With this outstanding accomplishment, both students are invited to take American Invitational Mathematics Examination (AIME). The AIME will be held on Thursday, March 3, 2016. This contest was established in 1973 as an intermediate step between the high school (AMC 10 and AMC 12) contests and the U. S. A. Mathematical Olympiad (USA (J)MO). The AIME is a 15 question, 3 hour examination in which each answer is an integer from 0 to 999. Students are very unlikely to obtain the correct answer by guessing. The questions on the AIME require only high school mathematics, and are much more difficult than those on the AMC 10 and AMC 12. Congratulations to Esha Ranade and Jimmy Wang again for this great success.

According to Dr. Mark Saul, who serves as Director of the American Mathematics Competitions, the AMC 12 (first offered in 1950), and the AMC 10 (first offered in 2000), are part of a series of contests sponsored each year by The Mathematical Association of America, through their program, the American Mathematics Competitions. The AMC offers the only math competition series in the country leading to the United States of America Mathematical Olympiad (USAMO), the United States of America Junior Mathematical Olympiad (USAJMO) and the Mathematical Olympiad Summer Program (MOSP). From this group of students, the AMC sends the highly competitive USA Team to the prestigious annual International Mathematical Olympiad.



Drop Off

Students are to be dropped off to school no earlier than 7:30AM. Students dropped after 8:05AM must be signed in by a parent or guardian, regardless of grade level.
