# **AMC 8 Recap**

OSS Students Participate in Nationwide Mathematical Competition

Each year thousands of students across the nation apply their problem-solving skills in the annual Mathematical Association of America's American Mathematics Competitions 8 (AMC 8). The AMC program is dedicated to developing the next generation of problem solvers through friendly competition. This year 75 students from Orlando Science Schools took the AMC 8, which covers middle school mathematics concepts, and competed for local and national awards. In 2016, more than 130,000 students from more than 2,000 schools participated in the AMC 8 nationwide.

Congratulations to 8th grader Minh L. for getting first place with a perfect score.

Additionally, Orlando Science Schools received the very prestigious Distinguished Honor Roll School Certificate with a team score of 73 out of 75. We are so proud of our students who competed in the national exam!

#### What is AMC 8 ?

The AMC 8 is a 25-question, 40-minute, multiple choice examinations in middle school mathematics designed to promote the development of problem-solving skills. The AMC 8 provides an opportunity for middle school students to develop positive attitudes towards analytical thinking and mathematics that can assist in future careers. Students apply classroom learned skills to unique problem-solving challenges in a low-stress and friendly environment.

Once again, OSS mathletes did an amazing job and brought many trophies to home. Algebra 1 team received 1st place and both Algebra 2 and Pre-Calculus teams ranked 2nd place.

Additionally, Ritam B. received 1st place in Algebra 1 and received a tuition scholarship of \$2500 to study at FGCU.

The FGCU Invitational Mathematics Competition is offered by the Department of Chemistry and Mathematics to encourage students to develop their interests and abilities in mathematics. The competition is administered on the main campus of Florida Gulf Coast University located in Fort Myers, Florida. Participation is open to all middle school, junior high school and senior high school students and is divided into six divisions: Algebra I, Algebra II, Geometry, Statistics, Pre-Calculus and Calculus.



# Meizen High School Visit

There was a special presentation on Japan at our school on Thursday, including a discussion of that nation's two main cultures – traditional culture, and pop culture; the latter also known as "cool Japan." The presentation was made by a group of students who came to Orlando from Meizen High School, located in Kurume City, Japan. The 20 science students from Meizen joined the OSS robotics and HBS students to present projects, tour classrooms, and learn about the curriculum of the school. And it was the third time that OSS has hosted these Japanese students. They are one of top 100 science schools in Japan and we are looking forward to visiting them in Japan next year!
