Week in History

America's first automatic teller machine (ATM)

In 1969, America's first automatic teller machine (ATM) makes its public debut, dispensing cash to customers at Chemical Bank in Rockville Center, New York. ATMs went on to revolutionize the banking industry, eliminating the need to visit a bank to conduct basic financial transactions. By the 1980s, these money machines had become widely popular and handled many of the functions previously performed by human tellers, such as check deposits and money transfers between accounts. Today, ATMs are as indispensable to most people as cell phones and e-mail.

Several inventors worked on early versions of a cash-dispensing machine, but Don Wetzel, an executive at Docutel, a Dallas company that developed automated baggage-handling equipment, is generally credited as coming up with the idea for the modern ATM. Wetzel reportedly conceived of the concept while waiting on line at a bank. The ATM that debuted in New York in 1969 was only able to give out cash, but in 1971, an ATM that could handle multiple functions, including providing customers' account balances, was introduced.

SEVERE WEATHER/RAINY DAY



During severe weather situations, Orange County Public Schools must adhere to emergency management procedures.

One of these procedures is the implementation of the "30-30 Rule" during dismissal to determine the threat of lightning.

The "30-30 Rule" states:

30 Seconds: Count the seconds between seeing lightning and hearing thunder. If this time is less than 30 seconds, lightning is still a potential threat. Seek shelter immediately.

30 Minutes: After hearing the last thunder, wait 30 minutes before leaving shelter. Half of all lightning deaths occur after the storm passes. Stay in a safe area until you are sure the threat has passed.

The Principal will determine when the 30/30 Rule or Rainy Day Procedure will be applied. Parents may enter the building and sign out the students under their supervision.

Also, if it is raining when you drop your student off before 7:30 am, please drop them off in the back under the canopy until the front awning has been replaced.
