THIS WEEK IN HISTORY

DECEMBER 7, 1941: PEARL HARBOR WAS ATTACKED.

AT 7:55 A.M. HAWAII TIME, A JAPANESE DIVE BOMBER BEARING THE RED SYMBOL OF THE RISING SUN OF JAPAN ON ITS WINGS APPEARS OUT OF THE CLOUDS ABOVE THE ISLAND OF OAHU. A SWARM OF 360 JAPANESE WARPLANES FOLLOWED, DESCENDING ON THE U.S. NAVAL BASE AT PEARL HARBOR IN A FEROCIOUS ASSAULT. THE SURPRISE ATTACK STRUCK A CRITICAL BLOW AGAINST THE U.S. PACIFIC FLEET AND DREW THE UNITED STATES IRREVOCABLY INTO WORLD WAR II.

FIVE OF EIGHT BATTLESHIPS, THREE DESTROYERS, AND SEVEN OTHER SHIPS WERE SUNK OR SEVERELY DAMAGED, AND MORE THAN 200 AIRCRAFT WERE DESTROYED. A TOTAL OF 2,400 AMERICANS WERE KILLED AND 1,200 WERE WOUNDED, MANY WHILE VALIANTLY ATTEMPTING TO REPULSE THE ATTACK

THE DAY AFTER PEARL HARBOR WAS BOMBED, PRESIDENT ROOSEVELT APPEARED BEFORE A JOINT SESSION OF CONGRESS AND DECLARED, "YESTERDAY, DECEMBER 7, 1941--A DATE WHICH WILL LIVE IN INFAMY--THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA WAS SUDDENLY AND DELIBERATELY ATTACKED BY NAVAL AND AIR FORCES OF THE EMPIRE OF JAPAN." AFTER A BRIEF AND FORCEFUL SPEECH, HE ASKED CONGRESS TO APPROVE A RESOLUTION RECOGNIZING THE STATE OF WAR BETWEEN THE UNITED STATES AND JAPAN.

Orlando Science Schools is offering another great opportunity to its High School Students. College Road has so many requirements. Community Service is one of them. OSS Service Learning club is offering its students service learning in Orlando Science Center. With Youth Volunteer Program, OSS High School Students (9th, 10th Graders) will continue to earn the Community Service Hours at Orlando Science Center continuously. Earning Community service hours by involving in Science is also extra plus for college application. After your student is eligible, s/he will follow the certain schedule and help the visitors and involve in Science at Orlando Science Center. They will complete their community Service hours between 8 to 20 hours per month depending on your student's demand. There are some requirements to be part of the youth Volunteer Program. To become an applicant, the Youth Volunteer Coordinator must first receive the following:

- A letter of recommendation from a teacher. One of his/her teacher.
- A copy of a recent report card showing at least a GPA of 3.0 or higher.

If your GPA is 3.0 or higher and would like to be part of this great program, please fill the Application form and then with one recommendation letter turn in to **Mr. Yalcin by January 6th Friday**. All the applications will be sent together.

Once your application is completed you will receive a mail and your student will be invited to the Orientation meeting in the mid January-(The orientation date will be sent with the mail.)
