This Week In History

January 2, 1905 - Port Arthur captured by Japan

The Russo-Japanese war began in 1904 as a result of both the Empire of Japan and the Russian Empire's ambitions to control the areas of Manchuria and Korea. The Russians were confident as was the case of any European power going against an "uncivilized" culture at the time. The resulting battles proved devastating for the Russians.

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Port Arthur was a major spot of contention between the two since even before the war. Located in the Liaotung Peninsula in Manchuria, China - the port was an extremely strategic fort heavily fortified by the Russians since 1897. The fort was under command of the often incompetent Anatoly Stoessel who refused to leave command despite being replaced by Tsar Nicholas II. His opponent was General Nogi Maresuke, an honored Japanese officer who not only outnumbered Stoessel almost 3 to 1, but was noted as the man who captured Port Arthur in one day for Japan in 1894 during the First Sino-Japanese War.



The Russians held out surprisingly well from July 30th until the following year. It seemed Maresuke's overconfidence gave the Russians a fighting chance. However, in the end, the port was captured on January 2, 1905 and the entire Russian fleet was destroyed by Japanese warships. It was the beginning of the end for Russia's chances of defeating the Japanese empire.



The consequences of the war are groundbreaking in the world political theater. This was the first time in modern history that a European power had be defeated by an Asian country. The loss of the war would further weaken the hold of Tsar Nicholas and ultimately would lead to his downfall in 1917. For the Japanese, it launched them as major players in world affairs and were beginning to be recognized as the one and only major power in Asia.

Dress Code Reminders

OSS is a uniform school. Please make sure you are aware of our dress code! All uniform expectations are in the Student Agenda/Handbook.

Miscellaneous Guidelines:

Shirts must be tucked in.

Logos must be worn on shirts.

No "hoodies" should be worn to class or within the school during classes.

Undergarments must not be exposed.

Hair, face, body paint, and tattoos are inappropriate for school and not permitted.

Athletic outfits are not permitted in the school building, except in P. E. classes and dress down days.

Clothing with rips, tears, holes or frayed edges is considered inappropriate for school.

Extreme hairstyles are not permitted: Mohawk cuts, hair coloring other than standard frosting or natural highlighting, hair art, design or words cut into hair, and should not attract undue attention.

Belts must be solid black or brown.

Shoes cannot have extensive graphics or wild colors.

Winter Guidelines:

Hats or gloves of any type cannot be worn once the student has entered the building.

Boots are not permitted at school, except on dress down days.

Jackets must be purchased from our uniform company.

Undershirts must be solid red or blue for middle school students and grey or light blue for high school students.
