This Week in History

January 25, 1915 – Alexander Graham Bell makes the first transcontinental call.

Claimed as both an American and Canadian pioneer, Bell started his career as a teacher for the deaf and mute in New England. It was there that Bell began experimenting with devices to enhance sound such as the harmonic telegraph. This experiment, as well as his methods however, proved harmful to the students and Bell retired from the school.

After his departure, Bell began to experiment more on his harmonic telegraph, working more and more with the idea of traveling sound. By 1875, the race for sending sound over telegraph wire was underway, with competition in the likes of such great inventors as Thomas Edison. Bell kept much of his work in secret compartments, for the fear of industrial espionage that was rampant at this time.

By 1877, Bell and assistant Thomas Watson established the Bell Telephone Company. The telephone sensation spread and by the turn of the century, hundreds of thousands of homes had Bell's device. The greatest accomplishment was yet to come. 1915 proved to the world that the telephone was the wave of the future when Bell was able to make a call from New York City to San Francisco. Not only did the future of the telephone become secure, but Bell had helped the world take one step closer to becoming smaller.

After four rounds of the match which included US landmark questions, population map analysis, and world geography questions, finalists Reynardo Jittan and Cory Ruchlin entered the Championship Round. The two eighth graders vied through two rounds of world geography questions before Cory Ruchlin prevailed, earning the title of Orlando Science School National Geographic Bee Champion! Cory will take a qualifying test this week to try and advance to the state-level competition.

Dress Code Reminders

OSS is a uniform school. Please make sure you are aware of our dress code! All uniform expectations are in the Student Agenda/Handbook.

Miscellaneous Guidelines:

Shirts must be tucked in.

Logos must be worn on shirts.

No "hoodies" should be worn to class or within the school during classes.

Undergarments must not be exposed.

Hair, face, body paint, and tattoos are inappropriate for school and not permitted.

Athletic outfits are not permitted in the school building, except in P. E. classes and dress down days.

Clothing with rips, tears, holes or frayed edges is considered inappropriate for school.

Extreme hairstyles are not permitted: Mohawk cuts; hair coloring other than standard frosting or natural highlighting, hair art, design or words cut into hair, and should not attract undue attention.

Belts must be solid black or brown.

Shoes cannot have extensive graphics or wild colors.

Winter Guidelines:

Hats or gloves of any type cannot be worn once the student has entered the building.

Boots are not permitted at school, except on dress down days.

Jackets must be purchased from our uniform company.

Undershirts must be solid red or blue for middle school students and grey or light blue for high school students.
