


ORLANDO SCIENCE SCHOOLS WEEKLY NEWSLETTER

CELEBRATE BLACK HISTORY MONTH

Harriet Greene Tubman

Araminta Harriet Greene Tubman (1820 - 1913) devoted her life to fighting slavery, helping slaves and ex-slaves, and championing the rights of women. An incredibly brave woman, she was known as the "Moses of her people."

Araminta Harriet Greene was born a slave in Maryland. In 1844, Harriet married John Tubman, who was a free man. She escaped slavery in 1849 and traveled north. She then became a conductor for the Underground Railroad and helped slaves flee to freedom in the North (both to Northern US states and to Canada). The Underground Railroad was a secret system of people of all races who helped slaves escape to the North - it was not an actual railroad. Harriet Tubman made 19 dangerous rescue trips over 10 years, rescuing over 300 slaves from Southern states. Among the people she saved were many members of her family.

Mrs. Tubman helped John Brown recruit soldiers for his raid on Harpers Ferry (1859). She worked as a nurse, scout, and a spy for the Union during the US Civil War (in South Carolina). She continued to help rescue Southern slaves during the war.

After the war, she lived in Auburn, New York, where she founded the Harriet Tubman Home for Aged Negroes and worked for the voting rights of blacks. Harriet Tubman died on March 10, 1913.



This Week in History

February 9, 1995 – Bernard A. Harris, Jr. becomes the first African American to walk in space.

Born in Temple, Texas, Bernard Harris, Jr. always had an interest in science and medicine. He excelled in school where he competed in science fairs and other academic competitions. By 1982 he had earned his MD degree from Texas Tech University and began residency at the Mayo Clinic in 1985. Continuing his career brought him to work with the Air Force where he was being trained as a flight surgeon.

Harris had always had an interest in space since watching Apollo 11 in 1969. After getting in contact with NASA, Harris became a full astronaut by 1991. His first flight was on the famed Columbia spaceship in 1993. He made it into the history books though, on his flight on STS-63 in February of 1995. Where he and British astronaut Michael Foale to rendezvous with Space Station Mir. Here Harris became the first African American to walk in space.

Today Harris is involved in multiple charities and even has a school named after him. His newest focus has been on the development of education.
