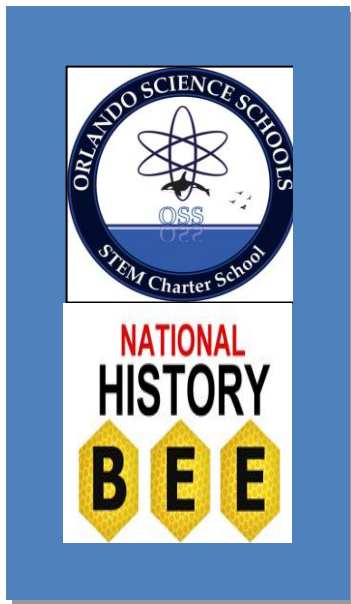

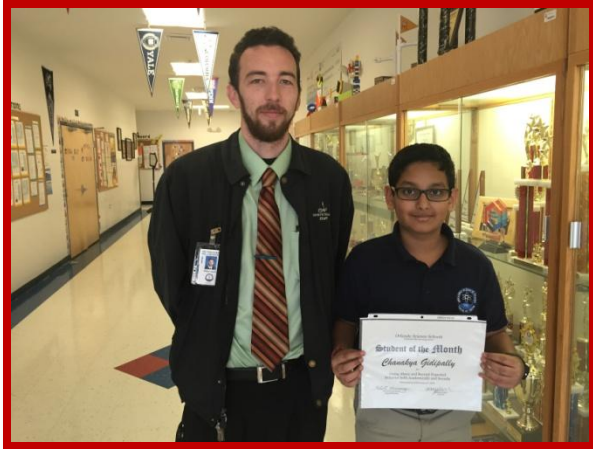
Science Fair Award Ceremony
