# *End of Year Reminders*

Dear Parents and Guardians,

The following details found on the following two pages are important as we approach the end of our current school year. Please read each of the items below carefully and let me know if you have any questions, note any item featuring an \* at the end of the title is required in order to receive your student's 2017-2018 Schedule at Open House.

- **Upcoming 7<sup>th</sup> Grade Immunization Documents\***: Original Copy due to School Registrar by Open House.
- **New Address\***: If you have moved, you must fill out the first two pages of the 2017-2018 Enrollment document. An original copy of your lease must be brought to the school registrar before school starts. You will also need a correct proof of Orange County Domicile. You will find these pages on [www.orlandoscience.org](http://www.orlandoscience.org) →Select the "Enrollment Form" button located on the navy blue bar on the left hand side of the webpage→select the "Enrollment Forms" link. Please note you will only need pages one and two.
- **2017-2018 Emergency Contact Form\***: Please be advised that ALL STUDENTS will be required to turn in a "2017-2017 Emergency Contact Form". These forms are not optional; if the form is not supplied to OSS by open house your student will not be given their 2017-2018 Class Schedule. Please note this form is found on page five and six of the enrollment document. Forms may be returned to your student's homeroom teacher or Ms. Smith at the front desk. You will find this form on [www.orlandoscience.org](http://www.orlandoscience.org) →Select the "Enrollment Form" button located on the navy blue bar on the left hand side of the webpage→Select the "Enrollment Forms" Link. Please note you will only need pages Five and Six.
- **Medication and Medical Supplies Pick Up**: ALL medication and medical supplies that are located at the front office with Mrs. Foley must be picked up by May 31<sup>st</sup> 2017. Any medications or medical supplies not picked up this date will be properly disposed of.
- **Blank Business Envelope and Stamp required**: We will be mailing your student's state test scores and final report cards once they arrive to you over the summer. It is advised that every student bring in a blank business envelope, stamp and slip found on page two before May 31<sup>st</sup> 2017. Please do not self-address the envelope, Ms. Smith will take care of that for you. If a blank business envelope and stamp are not provided by May 31<sup>st</sup> 2017 then you will have to pick up your student's test scores and final report cards at OSS when they arrive.
- **After Care Forms\***: Please note that for the 2017-2018 School Year ALL students will be required to fill out the "After Care Forms" located in the Enrollment Forms section of the website, regardless if students will be utilizing the After Care Service. . - **First Day of School:** The First Day of School for the 2017-2018 School Year is August 14<sup>th</sup> 2018
- **Locker and Lost and Found Clean Out:** Please be advised that all items must be collected from the Lost and Found Locations (GYM, Cafeteria, and Dismissal Door) and in your student's lockers by May 31st 2017. Any items remaining after this date will be donated or properly disposed of.
- **ADDitions Volunteers:** Please make sure to update your accounts over the summer as they expire every year. Parents, Guardians and other family members will not be eligible to volunteer or chaperone any school sponsored function unless these accounts are in current standings.

# DUKE TIP

### *Club Sponsor:*

The Duke University Talent Identification Program (Duke TIP) is a nonprofit organization dedicated to serving academically gifted and talented youth. Seventh grade students enrolled in the Duke TIP program take the SAT or ACT test, the same test that high school students take for admission into college. During club time on Tuesdays here at OSS, Duke TIP students would either attend competition math sessions with Mr. Akyalcin or attend Duke TIP club which included math sessions with Mr. Thomas to prepare for the big test. This year, our Duke TIP students achieved outstanding success: 24 out of 32 students, i.e. 75% of participating students, scored high enough on the SAT or ACT to receive state recognition, while 11 of these students received the highest honor, grand recognition. Students earning state recognition are scoring as well or better than 50% of college-bound seniors; students earning grand recognition are scoring at or better than 90% of college-bound seniors. What an accomplishment for our 7<sup>th</sup> grade students who are achieving such academic excellence this early in their schooling!



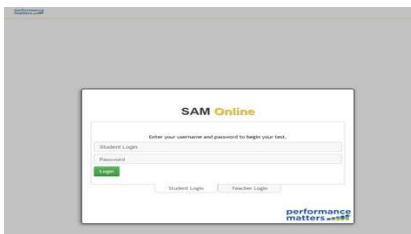
Dear Parents/Guardians and Students!

Benchmarks exams have been developed by OCPS and they are now available in Performance Matters Unify. They are mini assessments focused on certain benchmarks. This will allow you to see an idea of how your student(s) perform on each benchmark. These mini benchmarks have been uploaded to your student's account and their teachers will be able to see their assignment progress and results. These are a wonderful tool in order to better prepare your student for their upcoming testing season. We highly recommend that students take the practice mini benchmarks after school and at home. Every Friday, new mini benchmarks will be added to the student's accounts.

## OSS Graduation Dress Code:

- 1) Be sure that you try on your cap and gown as soon as you get it. You will need to take your gown out of its package and hang it on a hanger to let the wrinkles fall out of it.
- 2) **DO NOT DIRECTLY IRON THE GOWN UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES!** It will ruin the fabric. If you **MUST** iron it, place a towel between the gown and the iron to protect the fabric.
- 3) Full graduation attire is expected for those of you who intend to participate in Ceremony.
- 4) Tassels are worn on the **RIGHT** side of the cap during the ceremony.

### Ladies:

- 1) **Dress**-We suggest you wear a dark dress. The dress may not extend beneath the length/hem of the gown and should not shorter than knee level.
- 2) If you choose to wear hosiery under your dress, please be sure to wear hose that compliment your skin tone. No hosiery that is distracting will be permitted (pink, green, purple, etc.).
- 3) **Shoes**- We expect a dark dress shoe. The shoe must be secured to the back of your foot or heel by a strap. No extremely high heels.
- 4) Jewelry should be kept to a minimum. No facial piercings, please.
- 5) Your cap should be worn so that it sits flat on the top of your head, not on the back of your head.
- 6) No Gum.

### Gentlemen:

- 1) You must wear a **white dress shirt, a dark tie, dark dress pants, and dark dress shoes**. Anything light such as grey or khaki is not acceptable. Jeans, tennis shoes, hunting boots, Sperrys, Wallabies, sandals, bowling shoes, cowboy boots, hiking shoes, flip flops, etc. are not permitted.
- 2) **Ties** are a requirement for graduation. There is no exception to this requirement!
- 3) No obvious jewelry-earrings, necklaces, etc. **NO** facial piercings, please!
- 4) Your cap should be worn so that it sits flat on the top of your head, not on the back of your head
- 5) No Gum.

❖ Please note that appropriate dress is required in order to participate in the graduation ceremony. Since graduation is not mandatory, we expect you to dress and behave in the appropriate manner, or you may be removed from the ceremony. Many people have worked extremely hard to make this event a dignified and memorable experience in order to celebrate your accomplishments. Please do not diminish anyone's efforts by not dressing and behaving in the appropriate manner and please dress appropriately for the occasion.
